### SCHOOL VIOLATIONS

**SUNNYSIDE HIGH SCHOOL** reported a violation of the AIA Bylaws; namely, Article 14. General Provisions, Section 14.2 Practice

#### Reported Violation:

JV Softball conducted a scrimmage with a middle school. Teams shared a practice field. Two innings were played.

#### **School's Corrective Action:**

Practice only. The coaching staff has been counseled on all AIA Bylaws for softball. The assistant coach received reprimand and her re-hire for next year will be reviewed at the end of the season. The A.D. will conduct a coaches meeting to review AIA Bylaws at the beginning of next season.

#### **Executive Board Action:**

Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 16.1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Sunnyside High School **Softball Program** on <u>Advisement</u> for one year 5/18/15-5/18/16.

### <u>DYSART HIGH SCHOOL</u> reported a violation of the AIA Bylaws; namely <u>Article 15. General Provisions, Section 15.8 Parental or Legal Guardian Consent Rule</u>

### Reported Violation:

Ineligible boys' track athlete. Student was asked to complete his eligibility packet as required for all students. He completed his physical exam and all other requirements with the exception of the parent signature. The parent gave the coach verbal approval, but failed to sign the form. The athletic office could not accept the packet without the signature. The coach allowed the athlete to participate assuming that he had been cleared. The coach has been coaching for nine (9) years and has never had a violation of policy or bylaws. He took ownership of his error and has been involved in creating a solution that will ensure it never happens again.

#### **School's Corrective Action:**

No contests forfeited. The times were not qualifying and no one was displaced, so there was no disqualification that could be initiated. The entire coaching staff will be retrained by the A.D. on proper procedures for athletic eligibility. They will be required to submit written verification for athletes in their programs and review the new google.doc.

#### **Executive Board Action:**

Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 16.1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Dysart High School **Boys' Track Program** on <u>Warning</u> for one year 5/18/15-5/18/16.

## SCHOOL VIOLATIONS - Cont'd

### <u>SKYLINE HIGH SCHOOL</u> reported a violation of the AIA Bylaws; namely <u>Article 15. General Provisions, Section 15.12 Recruitment Rule</u>

#### Reported Violation:

The Skyline administration challenged their coaches to develop programs to support young students in their athletic development. In an effort to accomplish this, a Skyline coach operated a camp open to any students. Skyline coach went to a feeder junior high school and spoke to specific athletes (some living in another high school's boundary area) about attending a Skyline athletic camp. A camp flyer was distributed to only those students who played a specific sport at the junior high school.

## **School's Corrective Action:**

Skyline administration will meet with all coaches to educate them on recruitment rules. Meeting with junior high athletes will occur before or after school hours.

Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 16.1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Skyline High School **Activities Program** on <u>Warning</u> for one year 5/18/15-5/18/16.
