## > <u>HEAT RELATED ILLNESS (David Hayward)</u>

- David looked over the AIA policy and believes that it's a strong policy. We meet the basic guidelines for the KSI guidelines.
- WBGT guidelines we do not mention anything regarding these.
  - The committee recommends that in extreme environmental situations that changing work to rest ration is needed. Would need to increase the rest and would need to provide water at all times.
  - Breaks should to take place in shaded area.
- If educational opportunities are not being utilized people might give push back if they are not fully understanding the policy.
  - Suggest to communicate and educate coaches prior to pushing the policy on them so they understand.
- Heat accalimization is there are opportunity with communication on recommending when outdoor sports should practice.
- Dave asked about a cold tub policy and if there should be one in place.
  - Javier asked Dave to create recommendations with cooling to review and determine if a policy is necessary.

  - They also suggested different phone applications that could be purchased to track the weather more closely.
  - Their recommendation would be "This decision can and should be made in consultation with school administrator, on-site health care professional and/or coaches."
