# > BASKETBALL COACHES ASSOCIATION – YOUTH BASKETBALL GUIDELINES

- Matt King discussed the AIA potentially adopting the youth basketball guidelines

- 70% of kids are leaving youth sports by the age of 13 due to overuse
- Seeing overuse injuries in students by the 9<sup>th</sup> grade
- Seems to be little resistance from the AIA basketball coaches across the state if the guidelines would be adopted.
  - o Biggest question would be how to mandate multi-sport athletes
- On a motion made and seconded the Sports Medicine Advisory Committee approved to have the adoption of the Youth Basketball Guidelines be presented to the AIA Executive Board for formal adoption.
  - $\circ$   $\;$  Would this mandate only during season of sport or year round?

# HEAT RELATED ILLNESS INCIDENTS (Joe Paddock)

- Joe Paddock gave an update on recent heat related illness incidents that have occurred during the first few weeks of the football season.
- There have been a total of five student athletes treated three were heat related illnesses
  - Schools/administrators took the proper steps in addressing the illness
- Two students returned to practice the following day and one returned two days after incident
  - Students were not hospitalized they were discharged from the ER.

### > <u>HEAT INFORGRAPHIC UPDATE (Hayley Root)</u>

- Hayley presented the updated infographic
- The infographic indicates that the best time for practice in Arizona is between 6AM-9AM and 6PM-9PM

# > OPIATE EDUCATION UPDATE (Javier Cardenas)

- Dr. Cardenas discussed the process of receiving funding for the athlete online course for opiate use.
  - A grant had been applied for to assist with the building of the online program
  - Other states have shown interest in having a course for opiate use as well
- Concerns and issues of opiate use in student athletes have been presented at the National level
- Tempe Union High School District has been running a pilot program for coaches and parents regarding opiate use in high school student athletes.

### > UPDATE AND ACTION ON HB 2088 (Javier Cardenas / David Hines)

- Physical Therapists pilot program has been approved for PTs to be included in concussion protocol
- This is a 2 year pilot program
  - $\circ~$  PTs will need to have a Sports Certification in order to participate in the program
  - Department of Health Services will be the collecting and compiling all data
