EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REPORT

As another reminder the AD Information Meeting and Student Leadership Summit will be held at Xavier College Prep on Monday, April 22, 2019.

AIA Staff will meet with Joni Pabst, Executive Director of AIAAA, to discuss procedures regarding the AIAAA/NIAAA Membership Dues.

As part of the Strategic Plan the AIA is forming a Community Advisory Board of individuals from different business backgrounds throughout Arizona. The first meeting will take place on May 9, 2019 at the AIA Office.

The nominations submitted for the Executive Board openings have been sent to the conferences. The conferences will submit names to the AIA by April 4th, those names will then be brought forward to the Executive Board at the April 15th meeting for final selection. The positions that are currently open are 1A, 4A, 6A, ASBA and AdvancED.

The AIA Membership Survey went out to all Athletic Directors, District Athletic Directors, Principals, and Superintendents. A summary will be compiled and presented at a later date.

A \$160,000 grant was approved to begin the process of creating an Opioid Initiative Course for student athletes. The course will be structured similar to the Brainbook course students are currently required to complete.

SCHOOL VIOLATIONS

PAYSON HIGH SCHOOL – Payson Unified

Rule: Article 15. Student Eligibility Rules, Section 15.2 Application of Student Eligibility Rules (15.2.3)

Reported Violation:

Golf coach allowed three golf players to practice prior to the being cleared by the athletic department.

Schools Corrective Action:

Head golf coach has been reminded that players may not start practice until cleared by the Athletic Department. He has been given a review of the clearance of athletes' policies and procedures with the AD. A letter of direction has also been placed in his file.

Executive Board Action:

Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 16.1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Payson High School **Golf Program** on <u>Warning</u> for one year 3/18/19-3/18/20.

BISBEE HIGH SCHOOL – Bisbee Unified

Rule: Article 14. General Provisions, Section 14.2 Practice (14.2.1)

Reported Violation:

Baseball coach held a non-mandatory practice on Sunday. His thought being because of the severe weather (snow) on Friday and Saturday that a practice could he held as long as it was not mandatory.

Schools Corrective Action:

Coach was brought in and the Rule 14.2.1 was explained. He understands the violation and has been written up by the administration. Any further infraction will result in suspension. All coaches have been notified of the rule and understand the ramifications.

Executive Board Action:

Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 16.1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Bisbee High School **Baseball Program** on <u>Advisement</u> for one year 3/18/19-3/18/20.

BRADSHAW MOUNTAIN HIGH SCHOOL – Humbolt Unified

Rule: Article 14. General Provisions, Section 14.3 Maximum Teams Per Sport / Student Grade Level for Team Participation (14.3.2.2)

Reported Violation:

My girls' tennis coach accidentally played a senior in a JV match. He didn't realize the error until the match had begun.

Schools Corrective Action:

Contests Forfeited. Coach will need to ask the opposing coach the level of play prior to the match beginning. Coach will need to stop the match if there are any errors with matchups.

Executive Board Action:

Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 16.1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Bradshaw Mountain High School **Girls' Tennis Program** on <u>Advisement</u> for one year 3/18/19-3/18/20.

SCHOOL VIOLATIONS - Cont'd

TANQUE VERDE HIGH SCHOOL – Tanque Verde District

Rule: Article 15. Student Eligibility, Section 15.7 Physical Examination Rule (15.7.1)

Reported Violation:

The head softball coach allowed an athlete that was not cleared through the Athletics office, to participate in a practice on 2/6/19. The student did not have the required medical physical on file.

Schools Corrective Action:

Participation policies were reviewed during the spring coaches' meeting. An email reminder was sent out to the spring coaches regarding eligibility lists. This procedure will continue to be followed. The head coach was given a letter of reprimand. The AD will be present at tryouts to ensure this policy is being followed.

Executive Board Action:

Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 16.1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Tanque Verde High School **Softball Program** on <u>Warning</u> for one year 3/18/19-3/18/20.

NOGALES HIGH SCHOOL – Nogales Unified

Rule: Article 15. Student Eligibility, Section 15.7 Physical Examination Rule (15.7.1)

Reported Violation:

An softball player who had not been cleared through the athletics' office was allowed to practice without having a physical on file. Each coach is provided a list of cleared athletes for try-outs during each day of try-outs. The first-year coach delegated attendance taking duty to a student manager, and realized the mistake and reported to the athletic office.

Schools Corrective Action:

The AD and Principal provided an in-service training to the coach and outlined and reinforced the athletics procedures for physical clearance. The coach as provided a copy of the AIA bylaws regarding the physical examination clearance. The coach understands the mistake, and has taken direct responsibility.

Executive Board Action:

Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 16.1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Nogales High School **Softball Program** on <u>Warning</u> for one year 3/18/19-3/18/20.

SCHOOL VIOLATIONS - Cont'd

CAMP VERDE HIGH SCHOOL – Camp Verde Unified

Rule: Article 15. Student Eligibility, Section 15.8 Parental or Legal Guardian Consent Rule (15.8.1)

Reported Violation:

A male golfer was allowed to practice without turning in a parent signature giving consent for the sport.

Schools Corrective Action:

To ensure this oversight will be corrected moving forward, I met with the coach detailing the problem that occurred this year as well as steps he must take to ensure this will not happen again. in addition, a letter of direction has been written and sent to the coach detailing the process that he must follow to clear athletes before participation.

Executive Board Action:

Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 16.1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Camp Verde High School **Boys' Golf Program** on <u>Advisement</u> for one year 3/18/19-3/18/20.

Mark Showers abstained.

DESERT RIDGE HIGH SCHOOL – Gilbert Public School District

Rule: Article 15. Student Eligibility, Section 15.10 Transfer Rule (15.10.1.1)

Reported Violation:

Desert Ridge High School had an ineligible female track athlete compete in a dual track event against Skyline on 2/27. This athlete also competed in the Queen Creek Desert Classic Invitational on 3/1. The athlete transferred here from another school where she competed in track the year before, and should have not participated in competitive duals or invitationals until sitting out the 1st half of the season.

Schools Corrective Action:

Contest forfeited. Starting with our next dual/invitational, the student-athlete will set out the next 6 competitions. Track coaches will be in serviced on transfer rules and a new system will be put in place to ensure all track athletes are properly cleared and eligible to compete.

Executive Board Action:

Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 16.1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Desert Ridge High School **Girls' Track Program** on <u>Advisement</u> for one year 3/18/19-3/18/20.

SCHOOL VIOLATIONS - Cont'd

<u>**RAYMOND S KELLIS HIGH SCHOOL**</u> – Peoria Unified School District Rule: Article 15. Student Eligibility, Section 15.10 Transfer Rule (15.10.1.1)

Reported Violation:

A student participated in a track and field invitational and she is still ineligible because of the transfer rule. We are waiting to hear back about the hardship we submitted but at the time of the invitational she was ineligible.

Schools Corrective Action:

Contest forfeited.

Executive Board Action:

Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 16.1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Raymond S. Kellis High School **Girls' Track Program** on <u>Advisement</u> for one year 3/18/19-3/18/20.
