❖ UPDATES ON PRO SPORTS / COLLEGE SPORTS / SECONDARY SCHOOLS

- National Hockey League
 - Bubble (2 locations) (Alberta and Ontario)
 - Has been highly successful bubble was very stringent
 - Not sure what will happen next season
- Major League Baseball Diamondbacks
 - Currently no positive in system.
 - Bubble was successful
- PAC 12
 - Talks about having a football season if the numbers go down.
- National Football League
 - No bubble
 - Teams traveling (higher concerns)
 - Very strict protocol of who goes with the team when traveling (including owners)
 - Game day personnel will be tested

ARTICLE 17 CONCERNS

❖ NORTHERN SCHOOLS MODIFICED SPORT OF SEASON PROPOSAL

- No traveling outside of their area at this time
