Selects and meets with the public address announcers and discusses their role in the AIA PVWH program
Provides unbiased public address announcers and athletic contests.
Displays the AIA PVWH banner in a conspicuous location at athletic contests.
Models six pillars by adhering to Arizona Accord guidelines
Provides a script for the public address announcer (attach copy)
Provides appropriate personnel at each interscholastic event.
Encourages each coach to present a PVWH award at the end of the season.
Requires all coaches to complete the Coach Self-Evaluation Form (attach copy).
Includes PVWH as part of pep rallies.
