MEMBERSHIP COMMENTS

Mr. Bill Gahn introduced to the Board the following staff from Deer Valley High School: Lori Mora – Assistant Principal Larry Eubanks – Athletic Director Eric Bolus – Football Coach

Ms. Brigitte Dayton from the Catholic Community Foundation addressed the Board regarding the Jackie Ranger Hutt Sport Life Coaching Scholarship and the application process. The Board referenced bylaw 15.12.4.1 and had concerns regarding the eligibility requirement of the applicant - applicant must be an 8th grade student who has been accepted to Xavier College Prep, demonstrates financial need through FAIR process and **shows interest in sports/athletics**. The Board did not approve the scholarship and application process.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REPORT

Mr. Dave Stead, Executive Director from Minnesota, addressed the Board and provided information regarding Robotics. The Board enjoyed the presentation and thanked Mr. Stead for the valuable information. The Board instructed staff to work with FRC (FIRST Robotics Competition) to establish an AIA Robotics State Championship.

Mr. Jeff Feldman and Mr. Ed McQuade from Greenway addressed the Board regarding home run derbies and catastrophic insurance. The Board suggested that Mr. Feldman hold his home run derby after the state championship baseball game to avoid violating the all-star and non-school participation rules.

Discussion was again held regarding policy for new programs such as Robotics. Dr. Slemmer and staff will continue to work on the process and will move forward with Robotics.

The Board was informed that Imagine Prep Superstition & Canyon View Prep dropped their membership.

5A Basketball Section Request – Tabled – Will address in December.

Open Discussion – Current Issues

<u>ASA</u> - Dr. Wilson discussed football. He asked if the Football Committee has ever considered flag football as an alternative for smaller schools related to the safety of the players. The Board discussed the playoffs and points of discussion as follows:

- Should 16 teams really be playing?
- Why not the top 8 instead?
- Championship top 8 teams
- Sub-championship bottom 8 teams
- Rankings are accurate with the outcome of playoffs

<u>3A Conference</u> – had questions regarding rankings. Dr. Slemmer explained that the AIA system was perceived as flawed and based on membership input, the current system now being used is accurate and utilizes the variables the Association has chosen, excluding those that are not in step with the Association's mission and philosophy.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO AIA CONSTITUTION & BYLAWS

On a motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, the Board <u>approved</u> the following as Emergency Legislation which will again be voted on by Membership at the March 7, 2014 Legislative Council Meeting:

AIA EXECUTIVE BOARD – PROPOSED AMENDMENT (Emergency)

Amend AIA Bylaws: Article 9 Finances (Page 21)

Rationale:

This change helps protect and ensure the continuing availability and economic viability of catastrophic injury coverage. It clarifies that demonstration and/or exhibition events are not intended to and will not be covered under the catastrophic coverage.

(Add Text)

Rule: Article 9 Finances, Section 9.2 Assessments

9.2 ASSESSMENTS

9.2.2 <u>Student Excess Accident Insurance</u> - Each member school (full and associate members) shall purchase excess accident (catastrophic) insurance to insure students against injuries sustained while engaged in school sponsored interscholastic sports and activities sanctioned by the AIA during the season of sport or activity as identified in the AIA Constitution and Bylaws. Demonstration and/or exhibition events (e.g., home run derby, slam dunk competition, three point shooting competition, closest to the pin competition, etc.) are not considered "sports and activities sanctioned by the AIA" and will not be covered by the catastrophic insurance referenced in this bylaw. The AIA Executive Board shall determine the insurance carrier for said coverage and notify member schools (full and associate members) of the carrier selected and the premium rate. Each member school shall pay the premium to the AIA office who, in turn, shall send a payment to the insurance carrier to cover the total annual premium for the member schools. It is understood that the AIA and the AIA Executive Board are not agents or representatives of, or in any way affiliated with, said insurance carrier. The insurance carrier shall set the terms and conditions of said coverage.

REQUEST - EXCEPTION TO AIA BYLAW 14.7

Rule: Article 14. General Provisions, Section 14.7 All-Star Competition

14.7 ALL-STAR COMPETITION

14.7.1 POSITION STATEMENT

The member schools of the AIA oppose all-star competition during the school year and shall oppose all efforts of any organization, agency or individual to establish such competition.

14.7.2 During the school year, administrators and coaches shall decline any invitation to participate in all-star competition, shall refrain from recommending any student athlete for all-star competition and shall refuse to provide use of any high school facility for all-star competition, unless specifically sanctioned by the Executive Board.

The school listed below is requesting an exception to AIA Bylaw 14.7:

REQUEST - EXCEPTION TO AIA BYLAW 21.5.3

Rule: Article 21. Basketball, Section 21.5 Number of Games in Season

21.5 <u>NUMBER OF GAMES IN SEASON</u>

21.5.3 No player shall participate in more than six (6) quarters/night.

21.5.3.1 <u>EXCEPTION</u>: Division IV, because of their limited enrollment, may permit a player to participate in an unlimited number of quarters/night during the season.

On a motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, the Board <u>approved</u> the following requests for exemptions from the 6-quarter rule in Basketball:

On a motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, the Board **<u>approved</u>** the following:

WRESTLING PROPOSAL

Mr. Al Trejo from the Wrestling Sports Advisory Committee provided the Board with a proposal which would allow wrestlers to be placed and advance in the 2013-2014 State Wrestling Tournament. Dr. Slemmer indicated that he has heard opposition to the proposal and suggested that the Wrestling Committee find an avenue to get the information out to all athletic directors and wrestling coaches for feedback and input. Dr. Slemmer suggested that in the future for seeding, wrestlers could be power ranked since the technology is now in place. No action taken.

SCHOOL VIOLATIONS

<u>SABINO HIGH SCHOOL</u> reported a violation of the AIA Bylaws; namely, <u>Article 14. General Provisions, Section 14.7 All-Star Competition</u>

Reported Violation:

Assistant football coach participated in the Global Football game in Italy. Coach was also the father of one of the six Sabino athletes who participated in the program in Italy. Coach had resigned verbally to the varsity football coach at the end of the football season last year and is now a Principal in Oregon.

School's Corrective Action:

Coaches will not be allowed to participate without requesting AIA approval.

Executive Board Action:

Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 16.1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Sabino High School **Activities/Athletic Programs** on <u>Advisement</u> for one year 11/18/13-11/18/14.

SAHUARITA HIGH SCHOOL reported a violation of the AIA Bylaws; namely, *Article 14. General Provisions, Section 14.72 Practice*

Reported Violation:

Spiritline – a practice was held on a Sunday at the Sahuarita High School gym.

School's Corrective Action:

Coaches will be in-serviced again on the rules regarding permissible practice dates. Letter of counsel will be placed in coaches' files.

Executive Board Action:

Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 16.1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Sahuarita High School **Spiritline Program** on <u>Advisement</u> for one year 11/18/13-11/18/14.

SCHOOL VIOLATIONS - Cont'd

ROUND VALLEY HIGH SCHOOL reported a violation of the AIA Bylaws; namely, Article 15. Student Eligibility Rules, Section 15.10 Transfer Rule

Reported Violation:

Ineligible football player. New student data system failure (Schoolmaster) – 6 weeks severe technical difficulties. New Athletic Director, counselor, and assistant principal. All resulted in incorrect student information identifying transfer students.

School's Corrective Action:

Contests forfeited – but rescinded at special Executive Board meeting held on 10/30/13. Technical difficulties have been rectified. Training will continue on the new system. A.D. will attend all AIA trainings on policy & procedures. Administrators and office staff will be trained on protocol for identifying new student athletes. Coaches will receive training on communicating with administration on any new student athletes in the system to verify accuracy of student athlete status. Athletic office and coaches will review student athlete list prior to the season. Will continue to work closely with the AIA in regards to future policy and protocol development.

Executive Board Action:

Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 16.1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Round Valley High School **Activities/Athletic Programs** on <u>Advisement</u> for one year 11/18/13-11/18/14.

<u>PARADISE VALLEY HIGH SCHOOL</u> reported a violation of the AIA Bylaws; namely, <u>Article 36, Spiritline, Section 36.10 Coaches/Coaching</u>

Reported Violation:

Hired new coaches last year. Coaches were AACCA safety certified and attended rules clinic, but thought rules clinic was for two years. Coaches did have NCA rules training in Summer 2013 but not NFHS AIA rules class. Spiritline practiced stunts and tumbled.

School's Corrective Action:

Added this to the Coaches Certification spreadsheet to prevent further issues and act as a reminder.

Executive Board Action:

Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 16.1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Paradise Valley High School **Spiritline Program** on <u>Advisement</u> for one year 11/18/13-11/18/14.
