

The Cats are coming back! When he was hired in November of 2003, Mike Stoops inherited a football program that had fallen on hard times.

He immediately showed he could recruit and began to bring better athletes to Tucson. He also watched his first two clubs finish with identical 3-8 marks, knowing his Wildcats were a play here and a play there from being a much better team.

In the second half of the 2006 campaign, the months and months of hard work began to pay off. UofA became a giant killer, knocking off Pac-10 foes Washington State, California and Oregon in consecutive contests.

Everyone knows a 6-6 ledger is a big step up from 3-8.

So what lies ahead in 2007?

Most Pac-10 experts predict the Cats will put together a winning mark and play in a bowl game for the first time in many years. Good things usually happen to teams that return 44 lettermen, including an impressive 19 starters.

As you may know, Stoops has made significant changes to try to spark his less-than-spectacular offensive attack. In fact, Arizona posted very modest averages of 17 points and 253 total offense yards per game last fall.

Sonny Dykes, of recent Texas Tech fame, was hired as the offensive coordinator to help push those numbers to much more respectable levels. And his track record says he'll do exactly that.

The stats for returning quarterback Willie Tuitama should take a big jump this year. The 6-3, 220-pound junior passed for 1,335 yards and seven TDs last year. He connected on 56% of this throws. Of course, he battled some concussion problems that limited his playing time in the first half of the season, but he should do much better in 2007.

With the Dykes system in place, UofA is going to throw the ball a lot more out of multiple formations. That means wideouts Mike Thomas (5-8, 175, Jr.) and Anthony Johnson (6-2, 210, Sr.) are going to see the pigskin more frequently.

As a sophomore in 2006, Thomas gathered in 50 passes for 597 yards and two scores. Johnson contributed 26 catches for 312 yards and three TDs. Youngsters like redshirt freshmen Terrell Turner (6-2, 175), Terrell Reese (6-4, 210) and Delashaun Dean (6-4, 198) will have every

opportunity to show what they can do. Junior Travis Bell (6-6, 245) and redshirt freshman A.J Simmons (6-3, 255) are battling for the starting nod at tight end.

Arizona's running backs are unproven. Former walk-on Chris Jennings (5-10, 225, Sr.) had a nice 2006 season, scampering for 451 yards rushing. Backups Xavier Smith (5-11, 199, So.), Terry Longbons (5-11, 200, So.) and Glyndon Bolasky (6-0, 205, Fr.) arrived on campus with great credentials, but they still must show they can compete at this level. Smith did run for 120 yards last year. The starting H-Back is sophomore Earl Mitchell (6-2, 250), a fine blocker and a capable receiver.

The young offensive line that took its lumps last year has grown up. All five starters – LT Peter Graniello (6-5, 296, Sr.), LG Daniel Borg (6-5, 276, So.), C Blake Kerley (6-2, 275, So.), RG Joe Longacre (6-3, 303, Jr.) and RT Eben Britton (6-6, 290, So.) – return and that should be a big plus for this year's squad. The Cats must continue to develop quality depth here. Somebody needs to push the starters and be ready to step in if injuries occur.

On the other side of the football, UofA has few problems. Defensive coordinator Mark Stoops has done a fine job; his guys have demonstrated talent, heart, speed and physical play.

With the Wildcat offense struggling for most the season, last year's defense allowed just 20 points and 326 yards per game. They had 26 takeaways and 15 sacks.

Seniors Louis Holmes, Spencer Larsen and Antoine Cason are the leaders. All three are candidates for conference and national honors.

Holmes, a 6-6, 270-pound defensive end, transferred from Scottsdale Community College a year ago. He went through his transition year to Division I football in 2006 and posted respectable numbers – 36 tackles, four sacks, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. He'll be much better this time out.

Larsen is a 6-1, 236-pound linebacker who led Arizona in tackles last season. He totaled 89 tackles (10.5 for losses), two sacks, one interception, three recovered fumbles and two forced fumbles. He's one of those players that seems to be everywhere and really disrupts what the other team is trying to do.

Cason (6-1, 182) might be the most talented player on the team. He's a great cover corner who was in on 62 stops last year. He also snagged three interceptions,

even though the opposition didn't throw the ball his way too much.

Assisting Cason in the secondary are holdover starters Wilrey Fontenot (5-9, 174, Sr.) and Dominic Patrick (6-1, 207, Sr.). Fontenot plays the corner opposite Cason and Patrick returns at free safety. Cam Nelson (6-1, 180, So.), Brandon Tatum (6-1, 181, So.) and Michael Klyece

(6-0, 193, Jr.) are competing for the open spot at strong safety.

Besides Larsen, the linebacking corps features junior Ronnie Palmer (6-3, 239) in the middle and senior Dane Krogstad (6-2, 236) on the strong side.

Palmer had 69 tackles and two picks, while Krogstad had 41 stops and one interception. This is a good set of linebackers, but quality depth is once again an issue. Wildcat fans are hoping Larsen, Palmer and Krogstad can stay healthy.

Holmes has plenty of help on the defensive front. Junior DE Johnathan Turner (6-3, 250) teams with senior tackles Yaniv Barnett (6-1, 285) and Lionel Dotson (6-4, 278) to form a top-caliber line.

Dotson had 31 tackles, including one sack, last year. Turner showed 18 stops, including two for negative yardage. Barnett also had 18 tackles and recovered a fumble.

The punting chores should go to redshirt freshman Keenyn Crier, while the placekicking duties belong to junior Jason Bondzio right now. Alex Zendejas, a talented freshman from Ironwood High School in Glendale, could be a factor in the kicking game.

Mike Thomas, Mike Turner, B.J. Dennard, Chris Jennings and possibly soph Devin Ross are leading candidates for kickoff and punt returns.

The schedule is not particularly kind – with the opener on the road against BYU, along with away games against Pac-10 rivals California, Oregon State, USC, Washington and ASU.

New Head Coach Pat Ryden inherits a team at **RINCON** that split their 12 games last year, winding up at 6-6. A formidable bunch of 13 starters are back to do some damage.

Big lineman Nick Ryan (6-5, 255) is a senior to watch at offensive tackle and defensive end. He'll receive support from fellow lineman Andres Thompson (5-10, 215, Sr.).

Of course, he needs someone to grab some passes and the Dorados are not hurting for receivers. The best returnees in that category are WR Ray Nettling (5-10, 185), TE Joe Bortano (6-2, 200), WR Derek Brown (6-0, 185) and WR Derek Matlock (5-11, 180) – all seniors.

Senior John Bour (5-11, 200) and junior Griffen Ronstadt (5-9, 165) are the primary running backs heading into the 2007 season. The offensive line is sparked by Brent Lush (5-10, 230, Sr.), John Tabor (6-0, 210, Sr.) and TJ Jacob (5-9, 200, Sr.).

It looks like another good year is in store for CDO fans. Nugent's team finished 8-3 a year ago. Twenty-two lettermen are back. The 2006 JV was 7-2. And the Dorados return a top-notch quarterback for his senior season. These are all very positive signs.

Coach Chuck McCollum has a very workable number (20) of returning lettermen at **SAHUARO**, but only two starters are back from his 6-5 unit of a year ago.

In addition to Davila, the leaders in the lines are Santiago Rocha (5-10, 220, Sr.), Andrew Saenz (5-10, 240, Sr.), Nic Svob (6-1, 190, Sr.) and Greg Taylor (5-9, 180, Sr.).

Mazzola, Wes Knight (6-1, 190, Sr.) and Andy Romero (5-10, 200, Sr.) form a very efficient set of linebackers.

In his first two years at the school, **MARANA** Coach Willie Dudley registered five victories against 15 defeats. Last year the tide turned and his guys wound up 6-5 on the year.

Skillful players like QB/S Robert Rowe and TB/DB Fabian Zazueta certainly helped the cause. Rowe (6-2, 185) excelled at both quarterback and safety, while Zazueta (5-11, 175) operated at tailback and defensive back. Rowe is actually the quickest player on the team.

Martinez has nine starters back in uniform from that team, so it's easy to be optimistic about the 2007 campaign. There's good talent and experience at the skill positions, headed by RB/WR Andy Garcia (5-11, 175, Jr.) and QB Miguel Maldonado (6-0, 185, Sr.). Garcia has 4.5 speed.

Expect WR Eddy Lopez (5-11, 175, Sr.), RB/DB Nick Rodriguez (5-7, 160, Sr.), WR

Eloy Cortez (6-2, 175, Jr.), RB/DB Edgar Villegas (5-8, 170, Sr.) and RB/LB Jose Vega (5-9, 180, Jr.) to also make some plays.

The Apaches may not be the biggest team in Arizona, but they can still be physical, especially with the likes of DE/LB Carlos Navarro (6-1, 190, Sr.), LB Miguel Alcantar (5-9, 185, Sr.), OL Max Montt (5-10, 215, Jr.), OL Juan Espriecueta (5-10, 215, Jr.), LB Abel Sanchez (5-10, 185, Sr.), DL Juan Cano (6-1, 220, Sr.) and OL David Romero (6-1, 220, Sr.).

The headliners at **DESERT VIEW** include four seniors and a junior. Certainly, Jim Monaco, in his first year as the head coach of the Jaguars, thinks HB/MLB A.J. Willis will be a player to watch this year. He's tough and very quick.

The quarterback is junior Brandon Gilliard (6-1, 198). He can hand the ball to Willis or pass it to slotback Marc Jackson (5-10, 184, Sr.) or wideout Lee Abrahams (5-10, 187, Sr.).

Another of the 14 returning starters is OG/LB Rene Robles (5-11, 200, Sr.). The Jaguars showed a 4-6 record last fall. Topping that mark won't be easy, but it's definitely possible.

PALO VERDE is comfortable in the favorite's role after a couple of extraordinary years. Coach Todd Mayfield's Titans won the 4A-2 state crown two years ago and were region champs last season. They're very highly regarded in 2007.

Four key players – WR/DB Adam Hall (6-2, 180, Jr.), HB/DB Andric Booker (5-10, 150, Sr.), OT/DT Jonathan McCroy (6-3, 270, Sr.) and HB/LB Robert Grant (5-9, 170, Sr.) – return to give the Titans a strong foundation this year. Altogether, 17 letterwinners are back from last season's 7-4 unit.

Other notables are TE/DE Mike Rodriguez (6-2, 220, Sr.), OT/DT Marcus Cools (6-6, 270, Sr.), OT/DT Derrell Palmer (6-5, 270, Sr.), FB/LB Lee Bloxham (5-11, 190, Sr.), OG/LB Victor Larranaga (5-8, 215, Sr.) and FB/LB Cyril Straker (5-8, 190, Sr.).

"We are moving from 4A-1 to 4A-2, so we're not familiar with players from some of these teams," says **CATALINA** Head Coach Shawn Wasson.

Still, it probably won't take too long to adjust and it might be a good move for the Trojans. Seven starters are back from their 4-6 club of a year ago.

High on that list of returning performers are WR/DB James Eichberger (5-10, 160, Sr.), RB/LB Casey Johnson (5-11, 170, Sr.), RB/LB Zoar Morales (5-10, 195, Sr.), OL/DL Hassilo Kushkoki (6-0, 210, Sr.) and QB/DB Justin Hoogland (5-10, 145, Sr.). Eichberger is talented, quick (4.55) and should land some awards for his play this year.

Additional support will come from OL/DL Kevin Rountree (6-1, 225, Jr.), WR/DE Andrew Grant (6-2, 195, Sr.), OL/DL Luis Rodriguez (5-8, 230, Sr.), QB/LB Brad Quinn (5-10, 170, Jr.), QB/DB Daniel McIver (6-0, 150, Jr.) and RB/DB Marcell Gray (5-9, 165, Sr.).

Jairo Pena (5-11, 230) and Charles Hill (6-2, 185) are a couple of steady veterans returning for their senior campaigns at **DOUGLAS**. Pena is a fullback and defensive tackle; Hill plays tight end and linebacker. The Bulldogs concluded last season with a 4-6 slate.

Running back-defensive back Ronald Hopper (5-10, 175) will be a positive force for the Panthers at **AMPHITHEATER**. He ran for over 200 yards last year in a supporting role and will be more of a headliner for Coach Verne Friedli this year.

SANTA RITA returns 14 lettermen from last year. Coach Jeff Scurran is counting on seniors Ace Chuisano and Chris Johnson to fill primary roles. Chuisano (6-0, 210) is a linebacker and running back with 4.7 speed. Johnson (6-1, 160) is a dependable quarterback set to run the Eagles' offensive attack.

Wideouts J.J. Holiday (6-0, 150, Jr.) and Christian Quintanilla (6-0, 140, Sr.) will fortify the receiving corps.

Additional Santa Rita mainstays are OG/DL Paul Perez (6-1, 190, Sr.), DE Orlando Roscon (5-6, 160, Sr.), DB Troy Smith (6-0, 155, Sr.), DB Clint Smith (5-9, 140, Sr.) and DE Andy Goble (6-0, 160, Sr.).

Scurran sports an overall coaching record of 220-73-1, even though his glittering winning percentage is suffering a little right now. He'll turn it around.

Coolidge in Historic Title Run Thatcher Also Favored

Coach Carlo Hernandez and his COOLIDGE Bears have won back-to-back championships. In the history of Arizona 3A football, just three schools have ever won three consecutive state crowns. If Coolidge prevails in 2007, the Bears will join the 1978-80 Santa Cruz Dust Devils, the 1991-93 Snowflake Lobos and the 1994-97 Blue Ridge Yellowjackets as the only three-peaters! (Of course, Blue Ridge stands by itself, capturing four titles in a row, posting four straight 13-0 campaigns in the process.)

But enough about history. Do the Bears have the team to get the job done? We think they do. The Bears are the near unanimous choice by opposing coaches to make it three in a row. Coach Carlo Hernandez has 22 lettermen back from his 12-1 powerhouse. Want to know how dominant the Bears have been lately? Hernandez sports a 78-10 record in his seven-year tenure at the school.

His biggest star this year might be senior FB/LB Brad Jackson, a 5-11, 210-

pound senior with 4.55 speed. He'll get plenty of chances to make big plays in 2007. Taking over for Wheeler at quarter-back will be either Charlie Garrett (5-9, 160, Jr.) or George Jones (5-11, 165, Sr.).

Placekicker Cody Barber (6-0, 175, Sr.) is a key performer for Coolidge, along with TE/LB Andrew Ashford (5-11, 180, Sr.), OL/DL Clay Gillespie (6-2, 220, Jr.), OL/DL Wyn Henderson (5-10, 220, Sr.), OL/DL Derek Gonzales (5-10, 200, Sr.), RB/DE Rodney Reagans (5-11, 210, Jr.), WR/LB Kevin Mitchell (5-10, 165, Jr.), WR/DB Zac Ross (5-10, 160, Sr.) and RB/DB Jeremy White (5-9, 145, Jr.).

If any team in the 3A South is going to dethrone Coolidge, it'll probably be the **SAFFORD** Bulldogs.

A new head coach will inherit 22 letterwinners, including nine regulars. And the JV had some talent a year ago, recording a perfect 9-0 mark.

There's excellent talent in the offensive backfield, in addition to good size and experience in the O-Line. Junior quarterback Justin Smith (6-0, 180) is a keeper. He runs the offense well and has terrific speed (4.6).

When Safford chooses to run, Smith can give the ball to senior backs Darryl Thomas (5-11, 165), Tyrell Andrews (5-8, 165) and Tony Larson (6-0, 190). Smith can also throw the ball to WR Michael Folar (5-11, 175, Jr.) and TE Steven Hernandez (6-1, 200, Sr.).

Anchoring the lines are seniors Jason Baca (6-2, 255), Luis Villalba (6-6, 235) and Daniel Romero-Zuniga (6-2, 325).

FLORENCE is gaining enrollment at record pace; now the Gophers have to adjust to life in the 3A ranks. The competition is fierce, but the 2007 Gophers could be up to the challenge.

Despite an unimpressive 2-8 ledger in 2006, many opposing coaches believe Florence could be tough this time out. Coach Shawn Cluff welcomes back 17 lettermen – including 12 starters.

A half-dozen players – QB Cash Clemans (5-10, 155), REC/DB Andy Martinez (5-9, 165), TB/LB Larry Andersen (5-9, 170), REC/LB Alfred Woods (6-2, 185), OL/DL Mickey Tryon (6-3, 225) and FB/LB Chase Simon (5-8, 185) – are mentioned by Cluff as his foundation for this year's team.

Clemans runs the offense well. Andersen is the quickest. Simon is the lone junior in that group.

"We will be young and have a limited number of players with varsity experience," says **GLOBE** head mentor Mike O'Neal. The Tigers do have a dozen varsity veterans on the field; those players helped record a 6-4 slate in 2006.

He's heavy with experienced skill-position players like RB/DB Brady Wager (6-0, 180, Jr.), WR/DB Colten Phillips (6-0, 175, Sr.), RB/DB Tober Francom (5-11, 200, Sr.), RB/LB Nathaniel Smith (5-9, 170, Jr.), TE/DE Brian Burgener (6-0, 185, Sr.) and WB/LB Damon Valencia (5-8, 170, Jr.).

Globe's number one returnee on the line is two-way standout Manny Bejarano (6-0, 205, Jr.).

Coach Jorge Mendivil seems to be putting together a solid program at EMPIRE,

where his Ravens earned an even split (4-4) in their schedule last year.

All 22 starters return from that team, so Empire should have a say about which teams survive in the tough 3A South Region. Senior Josh Garcia is the most accomplished returning veteran; he's a 5-10, 200-pound tight end and defensive end.

Coach Al Ocampo is into his second year on the job at **SANTA CRUZ**. The 2006 campaign left room for improvement (2-8), and that's the Dust Devils' mission for 2007.

Seniors Pat Carn (6-1, 190), Mike Guerrero (5-11, 190), Josh Leja (5-8, 175) and Ed Brady (5-8, 150) comprise a nice set of running backs. Bo Sanchez (5-7, 150, Sr.) and DJ Montijo (5-10, 160, Sr.) are the primary receivers.

The leaders in the line are Miguel Cazares (6-1, 250, Sr.), Mike Lujan (5-11, 180, Sr.) and Bruno Torey (5-8, 150, Sr.).

Denver Householder leads a contingent of 17 varsity veterans back for **THATCHER**. And they have a fairly easy job – bring back another 2A state title.

Householder is a true leader as both a running back and free safety. He's really quick (4.5) and should enjoy a remarkable senior year for the Eagles (11-4 in 2006).

Other honors candidates returning for Coach Don Conrad are OG/DL David Nicholas (6-0, 195, Sr.), OG/LB Frank Chavez (6-0, 200, Sr.), QB/DB Chris Aaron (6-2, 180, Sr.) and RB/LB Bryant Innes (6-1, 190, Sr.).

You might also follow the play of WR/DB Trent Christensen (5-10, 160, Sr.), RB/LB Jace Beals (6-3, 205, Jr.), OL/DL Jake Schuler (6-2, 240, Sr.), OL/DL Nick

Mallenaux (6-5, 275, Sr.) and McKay Stevens (6-1, 180, Jr.).

Things are rolling at **HAYDEN**, where Coach John Estrada guided his Lobos to a great 12-1 record last year, while the JV was finishing with an unblemished 7-0-1 slate.

A half-dozen key performers – RB/LB Joseph Lopez (5-10, 190, Sr.), C/LB Alejandro Estrada (5-10, 180, Sr.), QB/CB Rudy Figueroa (5-9, 170, Sr.), RB/FS Ramon Figueroa (5-8, 170, Sr.), OG/DT Esteban Gallego (6-0, 200, Sr.) and OT/DT Chris Martinez (6-3, 230, Jr.) – are expected to shine for Hayden this time out.

Seven offensive and six defensive starters returning at **BISBEE** should bring a smile to Coach Truman Williamson's face. The Pumas were good (8-4) last year and they have an opportunity to be much better in 2007.

Williamson lists his top returnees as QB/S Chris Munsey (6-2, 185, Sr.), QB/LB Sergio Dagnino-Rivera (6-0, 180, So.), RB/DB Jesus Dagnino (5-7, 165, Sr.), RB Steve Gonzales (5-8, 165, Jr.), RB/DB Dominic Gunsauley (5-7, 170, Sr.), RB/DB Matt Becking (6-0, 150, Sr.), SE Alex Navarette (5-7, 150, Sr.), FL/DB Jacob Amos (5-9, 160, Jr.), FL/DB Adrian Barogez (5-10, 165, Jr.) and RB/LB Matt Metli (6-3, 215, Sr.).

Others to watch include Thor Acuna, Eric Olander, Bryan Earnest, Alonso Dagnino, Willie Enriquez, Carlos Lopez, Luis Guerrero, Jacob Holguin, Carlos Moreno, Emilio Torrez, Roberto Marquez, Willie Rivera, Cesar Acala, Robert Flores and Raul Villasenor.

The prospects are good at **ANTELOPE**, where the Rams have 15 lettermen – including a dozen regulars – back on campus. Coach John Blabe, a 24-year veteran at the school, directed his guys to a solid 7-3 record last fall, while the JV was notching a perfect 8-0 campaign.

Is This THE Year for the Cardinals?

WHISENHUNT TAKES OVER AS HEAD COACH

Obviously, the Cardinals didn't enjoy much success in 2006. Fans of professional football teams that win five and lose 11 have very little to celebrate, with rare exceptions.

Management wasn't too thrilled either. At season's end, Coach Dennis Green was fired and the Ken Whisenhunt era began. Certainly, Whisenhunt has a great reputation in the league, having served on the coaching staff of the Pittsburgh Steelers for the past six years. And he brought along Russ Grimm to serve as his assistant head coach; Grimm is widely regarded as one of the top offensive line coaches in football.

It isn't as though the Cardinals don't have talent. In fact, that shaky 5-11 ledger could easily have been 8-8 or better, if Arizona had just closed out some games they let get away. Bitter early-season home losses to St. Louis (16-14), Kansas City (23-20) and Chicago (24-23) left fans shaking their heads in disbelief as they exited brand-new University of Phoenix Stadium.

Can they get it right? Start with second-year quarterback Matt Leinart. Green benched veteran Kurt Warner when the club started slowly. In the middle of a devastating seven-game losing streak, Leinart got the nod. He completed nearly 57% of his passes, threw for over 2,500 yards, but finished with more interceptions (12) than touchdowns (11). Warner contributed another 1,377 yards passing, but he was far from spectacular.

Leinart must become the quarterback the Cardinals envisioned when they drafted him. And the sooner the better. Because the franchise needs a great quarterback so badly, Arizona fans are hoping Leinart can grow up quickly.

He has a great pair of wideouts in Anquan Bolden and Larry Fitzgerald. They combined for 152 receptions for 2,149 yards and 10 six-pointers in 2006. And their numbers were down! Remember Fitzgerald missed nearly half of last season due to injury. In 2005, the pair totaled 205 catches for 2,811 yards and 17 TDs.

Former Indianapolis Colt Edgerrin James was signed last year to energize the rushing attack. The results were so-so. Yes, James gained his 1,000 yards, but he averaged just 3.4 yards per carry and his long-gainer of the year was 18 yards.

Everyone knows Arizona has been extremely disappointing in the offensive line. Big Leonard Davis left for Dallas and the



Cardinals brought in a couple of notable free agents (Mike Gandy and Al Johnson), along with first-round pick Levi Brown of Penn State to shore things up. It looks as though second-year pro Deuce Lutui is a keeper on the OL too. Grimm just needs to work his magic with this group.

Defensively, the Cardinals gave up 24 points and 349 yards in total offense per game. While not horrible, Whisenhunt will be looking for substantial improvement here too.

Veteran safety Adrian Wilson is a playmaker and

was named to the Pro Bowl last season for the first time in his career. He wound up with 82 tackles, five sacks, four interceptions and two fumble recoveries on the year.


