

4A State Tournament Action-Packed

The quarterfinal round of the 4A Conference is all set with the top for seeds still in place.

No. 4 Greenway (15-2) is the returning state champion, No. 3 Flagstaff (15-3) lost to Greenway in the semifinal round, No. 2 Estrella Foothills (18-0) lost to Greenway in the quarterfinals and No. 1 Deer Valley (17-0) lost to Salpointe in the quarterfinals.

No. 5 Salpointe (16-1) was upset by No. 12 Youngker (14-4) on Tuesday in first-round action and No. 9 St. Mary's (14-3) knocked out No. 8 Arcadia (14-3) in the other upset of the night. As a reward, the Knights will travel to play at Deer Valley on Thursday night:

No. 9 St. Mary's at No. 1 Deer Valley

The Knights came in second to Greenway in the 4A Skyline Region but still earned a split with the Demons and this will be the first meeting between St. Mary's and Deer Valley this year.

"Our team is led by a senior class that witnessed the varsity team have two tough losing seasons (3-14, 2-15) during their freshman and sophomore years, St. Mary's head coach September Lopez said. "A majority of the current senior class was a part of those two seasons. They decided that they wanted to change the volleyball culture at St. Mary's by committing to our off season work, passing their classes, and setting the bar high.

They have led the program to its second consecutive winning season and post season appearance."

Lopez lists Sr. OH Karla Ramirez, Jr. MB Leilani Clark and Sr. OPP Najla Betts as the team leaders.

"Majority of the team has played together for three years and that contributes to certain court awareness and synergy," Deer Valley head coach Jackie Wallace said. "The tough loss in the quarterfinals helped the team refocus, which has increased their motivation to finish strong."

Wallace lists Jr. S Bailey Fuches, Sr. MB Savannah Davis, Jr. OH Maleah Reynolds, Jr. Libero Carsyn Schuch and So. S Emee Fellens as the team leaders.

No. 7 Seton Catholic at No. 2 Estrella Foothills

The Sentinels captured the 4A Desert Sky crown and the team suffered a 3-1 loss at Estrella Foothills on Sept. 12. The Sentinels have seven state championship banners with the last coming in 2011. The team dominated the D-III ranks with all seven of their titles coming between 2003 and 2011 including four straight from 2008 to 2011.

Jr. OH Christina Kuras leads the team in kills, So. L Racheal Martinez leads the team in digs and Sr. S Delaney Shearan leads in assists.

"Much of this season's success has come from the girls playing together for the last few years and knowing each other's abilities and being able to spread the ball around," Estrella Foothills head coach Jennifer Gonzales explained. "Some of our biggest victories this year was our second place finish in the Coconino Tournament, a first place finish in the Wolves Classic (our tournament) and a 4-set win over Seton Catholic."

Gonzales lists So. OH Emma Barber, Sr. MB Makayla Hurles, Sr. L Nadia Trinidad and Jr. S Nayeli Mancilla as the team leaders.

No. 6 Bradshaw Mountain at No. 3 Flagstaff

Bradshaw Mountain took second to Flagstaff in the 4A Grand Canyon Region but the Bears took Flagstaff to five sets in both losses with one fifth set scored at 15-13 and the other at 16-14.

"We've posted big wins this season against rival Prescott twice," said head coach Karrie Platt. "Our team has incredible chemistry and they get along well on and off the court I credit much of our success to our senior class experience and our team chemistry."

Platt lists Sr. OH Jordyn Moser, Sr. MH Peyton Bradshaw and Sr. OH Mailani Manuel as team captains. Flagstaff won back-to-back state championships in 2012 and 2013 and the team is led this year by So. Gracelyn Nez, Jr. OH Alyssa Prager, Sr. L Paetyn Nakai and Sr. S Devynn Hatathlie.

No. 12 Youngker at No. 4 Greenway


The Roughriders pulled off the major upset of the tournament to date with a 3-1 victory at Salpointe and the team took second to Estrella Foothills in the 4A Southwest Region. Youngker lost to Greenway 3-2 on Oct. 28.

Jr. MH Gabby Belcher, Jr. MB Jalyssa Roger, Sr. L Sienna Cumbie and So. S Delicea McAuley are the team stat leaders.

The Demons collected state championships in 2015 and 2018.

"My team has had to overcome several obstacles this year, we were without Megan Mattingly for the beginning of the season due to a knee injury," Greenway head coach Sarah Peterson said. "Also, my dad, who has been the biggest supporter of this program for the past 17 years, got diagnosed with a rare disease two months ago. 

5A Conference Quarterfinal Notes:

Next Crop of Talent Producing for Defending Champ Millennium

No. 1 seed Millennium (33-8): Graduating five of the six leaders in kills last year didn't keep defending champ Millennium from the No. 1 seed again. "We have been successful this season because we have been able to run a variety of hitters to help keep us competitive and in positions to win," Millennium coach Julie Vastine said. "And with winning the state championship last year, the returners want that opportunity again, so the will and desire to win and compete is part of our expectations each time we play." ... Vastine's team split its two matches against quarterfinal opponent Verrado, which won the second match in five games (26-24, 19-25, 25-19, 22-25, 16-14). If it defeats Verrado, Millennium will play either Sunrise Mountain or Centennial in the semifinals. Millennium defeated Centennial twice and Sunrise Mountain once this season. ... Millennium has won 30 or more matches every year since Vastine took over in 2014. ... Junior OH Jordan Miller was close to 400 kills for the season and 200 digs. Freshman Eryn Jones was second on the team with 230-plus kills. Senior MB Amberly Blowers was leading the team in blocks with 92. Sisters Hannah and Kylie Waters had a combined 99 aces, 660 digs and 545 assists before the team's first round match. ... The volleyball program has won the AVCA academic award for the last six years. The team started volunteering at Estrella Estates, a retirement home, next to the school this season. "It has been an awesome experience for our program to give back to our community," Vastine said.

No. 3 Horizon (31-10): Horizon's quarterfinal opponent, Sunnyslope, defeated Horizon in five games during last year's state semifinals. But Horizon defeated Sunnyslope 2-1 during the House of Payne Tournament this year. ... This is the 35th time Horizon has qualified for the state playoffs under head coach Valorie McKenzie. It has won three of five state championship matches, reached the semifinals nine times and won 15 region titles. ... Horizon's rotation is comprised of one senior, eight sophomores and one freshman. But that freshman, Kendal Murphy, was selected the 5A Northeast Valley Region Player of the Year. She was averaging 3.1 kills per set and was hitting .337. Sophomore setter Keira Hall was a first-team All-Region selection this year. Sophomore OH Kaden Young (193 kills) suffered a concussion and was questionable to play at state. "We worked hard on our defense and have many weapons on defense," McKenzie said. "We play aggressive on both sides of the ball."

No. 4 Centennial (25-10): The team's leaders are seniors OH Ashley Lifgren, MB Nyjha Marcelin and setter Kacey Stewart. "We depend on (Ashley) for a lot, passing, defense and attacking from both front and back row," coach Cari Bauer said. "She is a .330-plus hitter. Nyjha has had a breakout season. She is very explosive and leads the conference in blocking. She also swings from the front and back row. Kacey runs our offense, which has many weapons. She's a great decision maker and is the heart and soul of the team. Stewart was tops in 5A in assists." Lifgren and Marcelin were freshmen starters when the

program won a championship in 2016. Other major contributors on the team include senior Trinity Weidinger, junior Kennedy Farley and senior Diana Lozano. ... The Coyotes have victories over Centennial and Sunnyslope this season. "We have some very talented girls who have been making contributions on varsity for three plus years," Bauer said. "They are a very close knit group on and off the court. The chemistry is amazing and they always put the needs of the team before their own needs." ... In the last three years, Centennial has won a title and lost to Millennium in the quarterfinals last year. ... Centennial's volleyball team was recognized for the first time at the school's annual academic awards ceremony.

No. 5 Sunrise Mountain (27-10): "This season we have been working more as a team and switching up some crucial positions on the court," coach Brandi Jans said. "Being a new coach, I decided to switch up our defensive strategy as well as our offensive pace, which has helped us so far this year." The changes worked. The team has won four more matches than last year and also picked up a huge regular season victory vs. the team it'll play in the quarterfinals, Centennial. "We have gained three new coaches this year, and the girls have been very responsive to our coaching styles," Jans said. ... Sunrise Mountain's leaders are senior setter Shauna Rath (97 kills, 157 digs), junior libero Haven Wray (416 digs, 37 aces) and junior Adna Mehmedovic (33 aces, 291 kills, 172 digs). ... The program made it to the 4A final two years ago and 5A quarterfinals last year.



Up next for Notre Dame is Northeast Valley mate **No. 2 Cactus Shadows (24-9-1)** in the 5A quarterfinals. The teams met twice during the regular season, with Cactus Shadows winning the first match in three games and the second in four games. The scores of the second match were 25-23, 21-25, 26-24, 25-23. Junior Lauren Wamsley led Cactus Shadows with 16 kills and hit .344 in that match. Wamsley, freshman Kamryn Gibadlo, senior Ashlyn Overby, senior Sydney Perry and junior Jordan Clouse each have more than 100 kills for Notre Dame. Freshman Sidney Parks leads Notre Dame with 321 assists.





Top-Seed Perry Seeks Breakthrough in 6A

Seven of the top-8 seeds in the 6A girls volleyball tournament won their opening-round matches on Tuesday night. It's a formidable group.

Top-seeded Perry is looking to break through to its first title match ever. The Pumas have bowed out in the semis the last two years. Corona is out for a fourth trip to the finals. Basha's last best advancement was the semis in 2015. Highland is in uncharted territory with its last quarterfinal appearance in 2010. Xavier has reached the semis or better 14 years in a row with seven titles in that span. The Gators are two-time defending champs. Hamilton remains in search of its first title with three semi appearances in the last five years and two runner-up finishes. Desert Vista has advanced to two semis or better in the last five years (2014 and 2015) winning titles both years. Chaparral was the lone, non-top-8 seed to prevail, topping No. 7 Sandra Day O'Connor in five sets. The Firebirds last advanced to the guarters or better in 2017 - a 5A semifinal berth.

The quarterfinal matchups for Thursday Nov. 7 are: #8 Desert Vista at #1 Perry; #5 Xavier Prep at #4 Highland, #6 Hamilton at #3 Basha and #10 Chaparral at #2 Corona del Sol.

Here's a capsule look at these teams as they go forward from the quarterfinals.

No. 1 Perry - Power-ranking match record: 15-2. The Pumas losses were both five-set defeats to No. 2 Corona del Sol and No. 3 Basha. The Pumas won the rough-and-tumble Premier Region for the second year in a row. They beat No. 5 Xavier Prep and No. 6 Hamilton twice and split with Basha. Victories of note - Two wins each over No. 5 Xavier Prep and No. 6 Hamilton and one each over No. 7 Sandra Day O'Connor and No. 8 Desert Vista. Stat check: Pumas spread it around on the attack with four players with 136 kills or more led by senior Tatum Stall (389) and junior Ella Rud (323). Sophomore libero Jordan Suan (371 digs) and versatile senior Sian Richardson (365) pace the defense. Junior setter Jenna Heller has 1,007 assists.

No. 2 Corona del Sol - Power-ranking match record: 14-3. The Aztecs have won a title and been second twice in the last three years. Their three losses are to

Xavier, Hamilton and Desert Vista. The Aztecs won the Central Region title for the fourth year in a row. Victories of note -- Two over No. 4 Highland and one vs. Desert Vista. Stat check: Seniors Nicole Newlin and Mady Noble lead the offense with 403 and 375 kills, respectively. Noble is in her fourth season as a key player in the varsity lineup. Senior libero Becca Morse leads in digs with 812 and Noble has 375. Sophomore Anita Babic (656 assists)and junior Ashley Hayden (463) team up for setting.

No. 3 Basha -- Power-ranking match record: 13-4. The Bears were solid to begin the season and have surged even more with the arrival of transfer Jaelyn Hodge. Since Hodge arrived Oct. 2, Basha is 7-1 in power ranking matches. Their losses are to No. 13 Desert Ridge, No. 4 Highland, No. 1 Perry and No. 6 Hamilton. Victories of note: Two over Xavier and one each over Perry and Hamilton. Stat check: Samantha Drewry leads the team in kills (486) and has added 337 digs, second to sophomore libero Haley Carrington (419). Senior setter Aspen Aldous has 1,115 assists. Hodge has 188 kills in 14 matches, three late in the season with 30 or more.

No. 4 Highland - Power-ranking match record: 13-4. By far the team that has progressed the most since last year is the Hawks, who were 6-11 in prm in 2018. Highland's losses are two to Corona del Sol, one each to Hamilton and Desert Vista. Highland was runner-up to Corona in the Central Region. Victories of note: No. 3 Basha and No. 8 Desert Vista. Runner-up finishes in two invitationals -- House of Payne and Westwood TOC. Stat check: Kill leaders are junior Samia Bhakta (450), junior Kennedy Williams (272), senior Alayna Roberts (238) and senior Anna Toolson (237). Libero Abby Peterson has 837 digs and seven other players have at least 136. Setter Natalie Palmer has 1,103 assists.

No. 5 Xavier Prep - Power-ranking match record: 11-6. The Gators started fast winning House of Payne Invite and performing well at Durango Invite in Las Vegas in September. Losses are two each to Perry and Basha and one each to Hamilton and Chaparral. Victories of note: Corona del Sol and Hamilton. Stat check: Kill leaders are seniors Bri McKnight (500), Jasmine McKnight (411) and Julianna Westfall (208). Dig leaders are senior Abi Converse (410) and junior Kaori Robertson (309). Sophomore setter Alexa Shiner has 1,175 assists.

No. 6 Hamilton - Power-ranking match record: 10-7. The Huskies have lacked consistent runs this season and the state tournment is all about consistent play. They lost more region matches than they won and that hasn't happened previously this decade. Losses are two to Perry and one each to Basha, Xavier, Desert Vista, Liberty and Chandler. Victories of note: Corona del Sol, Highland, Basha and Xavier. Stat check: Sophomores Jordan Middleton (439) and Micah Gryniewicz (309) lead in kills. Senior libero Bella Zapata is tops in digs with 422 and has plenty of company defensively with six teammates with 161 or more. Setters Diana Ethridge (674) and Reilly Babcock (507) share assists.

No. 8 Desert Vista - Power-ranking match record: 11-6. The Thunder endured an up-and-down October, but ended the month on the up. They finished with a threegame winning streak. Earlier in the month they dropped four of five matches. Their losses -- Perry, Corona del Sol, Highland, Xavier, Desert Ridge and Mountain Pointe. Victories of note: Corona del Sol, Highland and Hamilton. Stat check: Leaders on the attack are seniors Jennifer Soto (311 kills) and Brooke Blutreich (293).

Sophomore Kate Morin leads in digs with 487 and Blutreich has 296. Setting has fallen primarily to freshman Georgia Lee (907 assists).

No. 10 Chaparral - Power-ranking match record: 10-7. The Firebirds avenged two losses to O'Connor in the first round. Their power-ranking losses are two to Sandra Day O'Connor, and one each to Perry, Corona del Sol, Highland, Pinnacle and Liberty. Victories of note: One over No. 5 Xavier in five sets. Stat check: Seniors Cassie Seminoff and Kate Fitzgerald are solid on the attack and on defense. Seminoff leads the team in kills with 416 and added 397 digs. Fitzgerald (353 kills) and (521 digs). Senior libero Maddie Felker is tops in digs with 724. Setting is shared by senior Hailey Hertzog (727 assists) and junior Taylor Peters (358 assists).


