Two Years Is Too Long for Blue Ridge, Chino Valley To Be Without a Title

Phoenix Country Day two-stepped its way to the crown, interrupting the annual championship party of Blue Ridge or Chino Valley.


Either Blue Ridge or Chino Valley won the 2A fall boys soccer title between 2007-2016. But in the last two years, Phoenix Country Day celebrated as champions.

With Phoenix Country Day now in the 3A Conference, the 2A dance floor opened up for Chino Valley and Blue Ridge again. The perennial 2A powers earned the tops seeds in the 2019 fall tournament.

They battled once this year in the regular season, with Blue Ridge claiming a 1-0 victory in a tournament. For Blue Ridge, which has outscored opponents 153-12 this season, that was its closest match.

Blue Ridge took five shots on frame in that match, but four of them were saved by sophomore goalkeeper Trever Stazenski. Senior Kaden Brimhall's shot in the first half was the only one that eluded Stazenski.

In this year's state tournament, Chino Valley (14-2) faces a more difficult road to the final than 20-0 Blue Ridge, which

is seeking its 10th title. Chino Valley will host a team in the first round that it defeated 1-0 in the regular season, No. 7 seed Snowflake.

If it advances to the semifinals, it'll play either No. 3 Camp Verde or No. 6 seed Show Low. Chino Valley defeated Show Low 2-0 to start its season but lost 2-1 to Camp Verde on the road.

Blue Ridge defeated its first round state opponent, Wilcox, 6-0 on Oct. 4 and defeated East Region rival, No. 5 seed St. Johns, twice this year. The winner of the St. Johns-No. 4 Bisbee match will play the Blue Ridge-Wilcox winner in the semifinals.

TEAM NOTES

Blue Ridge: "We've got a lot of team chemistry through the years of playing together and a lot of talent," coach Brad Paxman said. "The team has done a good job of coming together and persevering through adversity.

"All of our players are leaders and we are fortunate for that."

Five captains dot Blue Ridge's roster, Tommy Pederson (state's goal leader with 48), Kadan Brimhall (29 goals), and defensive captains Riggs Wengert, Josh Miles, and Isaiah Pelagio. "All of these players are seniors, and they've been consistent hard workers and good examples to the younger players on what hard work looks like," Paxman said.

Chino Valley: "We have a pretty young squad this year," coach Todd Carey said. "Of our 11 starters, seven are sophomores, two are juniors and two are seniors. Although we are young, our squad is very passionate. They work hard every practice and put in a lot of time over the summer. They are very familiar with each other having played together since they were young boys. They are extremely passionate for the game and love playing." The team has allowed only 10 goals in 16 games. The team's captains are senior defensive midfielder Ethan Addy, senior forward Irving Vedolla and junior midfield/forward Angel Sanchez. Some of the other key players include: sophomore defender Ravi Holladay, sophomore defender Richard Flores, sophomore forward Orlando Santoyo, junior midfielder Quade Kellerma, and sophomore goalkeeper Trever Stazenski. The program has won six championships and was the state runner-up last vear.

Camp Verde: The team is 10-2 this season and won the 2A West Region despite playing eight road games. "We play well as team and are excited to be together," longtime Camp Verde coch Dave Miller said. The team's leader is senior three-year varsity player Kelton O'Grady, a sweeper. The program has won two state championships and several region titles. This year, 36 boys were in the program and remained academically eligible throughout the season.

St. Johns: "This year's team is a very special one to myself as I have been coaching them for the last six years to get to this point," coach David Romero said. "I have coached them through their AYSA years, Riot Club Soccer and now into their high school years. This group of young men have been able to be achieve so much this year like last year because of the effort they put in on and off the soccer field. They are truly a team of friends and have a goal each year of competing at the top level and determined to find their way to the top of the state tournament." The team is seeded fifth despite playing against schools with bigger enrollments. Junior midfielder Preston Wilson and senior midfielder Tucker Nielson are the team's standouts.

"Preston is very talented all around from his foot work to his ability to move the ball," Romero said. "Tucker is only 16, but he is key to why we can play in power positions. His ability to stop the ball in high pressure situations is outstanding and to do it at his age is incredible."

Romero credited former coaches Shondra Shade, TJ Hendrickson, J. Brown and parents for his program's familylike atmosphere and success. "We are coming after that title this year and are going to play our hearts out in every battle that comes our way," Romero said.

Snowflake: The team has scored more than 45 goals this year, an amount that it wanted to achieve. Senior defender Ian Brubaker, senior midfielder Devin Wills and senior forward Dallin Hipps are the team's leaders. "(Brubaker) is the heart and soul of our team," coach Joshua Johnson said. "He will do anything to help anyone. Devin is the voice of fun and entertainment. He can take any bad situation and turn it into a good one. Dallin is our runner and in charge of our conditioning. He is a competitive player and pushes the team to play even harder."

Notes: No. 8 seed WillIcox had registered only one losing season since 2006. ... **No. 4 seed Bisbee** has outscored opponents 63-21. ... **No. 6 Show Low** has reached the post-season every season since 2001.

Budding Rivals Northland Prep, Chino Valley Looking for 3rd Straight Trip to Finals

Northland Prep and Chino Valley is turning into quite a rivalry.

They met in the last two state championship games, and the last time Northland Prep lost a match in the past three years was to Chino Valley. Are they on a collision course for a third straight championship showdown?

No. 2 seed Chino Valley booked its latest state semifinal appearance after defeating No. 6 seed Camp Verde 3-0 in a play-in game. It now needs to defeat No. 3 seed Blue Ridge on Nov. 1 at Williams Field to clinch its fourth consecutive 2A Conference fall championship appearance.

No. 1 Northland Prep, the two-time defending champ, will meet No. 4 St. Johns in the Nov. 1 semifinal nightcap at Williams Field. Northland Prep defeated Chino Valley in the last two finals by similar scores, 3-1.

Not surprising, Chino Valley gave Northland Prep its toughest match this season during a competitive overtime game won by Northland Prep 5-3. Northland Prep outshot Chino Valley 12-10 in that match, as Mia Blair and Sydney Sventek each tallied two scores and junior Ellie Karren had three assists and a goal for the winning team.

Blair, the 2017 2A Conference Player of the Year as a freshman, missed the 1-0 loss on Sept. 27, 2018 to Chino Valley. But the team's "facilitator" returned just in time to lead her program to its second straight title.

Since 2017, Northland Prep is a very impressive 59-1. Blair has also been on a tear, scoring 41 goals in 16 games this season.

The junior, the state's points leader, has also recorded 31 assists for a team that has outscored its opponent 134-10 this season. But defenders can't keep their focus just on Blair.

That's because the state's leading goal scorer also starts for Northland Prep, junior captain Ellie Karren (44 goals). Aside from Chino Valley, Northland Prep has outscored 15 opponents by at least six goals or more.

Karren and Blair are usually on the receiving end of Sydney Sventek and her state-leading 32 assists. The scores might not reflect it, but, like last year, Northland Prep has been playing without a key player because of an ACL injury.

Kiarra Hovis suffered the season ending injury just before the start of this season.

The junior led the 2A Conference with 35 assists last year.

"We've made a lots of adjustments due to injuries and other variables throughout the season, and the girls have welcomed the changes and have improved every day," co-head coach Michael Blair said. "They really support each other on and off the field, making it a true encouraging and uplifting family environment. This is possible because our upperclassmen and specifically our seniors are great leaders and role models for the younger players."

It helps also that Northland Prep has a great defense, led by goalkeeper Payten Schmidt and defender Alyssa Sturm.

TEAM NOTES

Northland Prep (16-0): The team's GPA average was 4.04 and volunteered filling sandbags during the Museum Fire in Flagstaff this past summer. ... Senior captain Ginger Blodgett is the "calming force of the team."

St. Johns (8-6-1): The team defeated Show Low 3-2 in the play-in game, the same team team St. Johns lost to in last year's play-in game and this season. "I think that felt good for them," said coach Paul Otto about his team. "One of our goals was to win the region so we could skip the play-in game, but we lost to Show Low during the regular season. So it was satisfying to them to overcome the (Show Low) hump and get to the semifinals." Kinley Crosby scored twice and Liberty Raven scored the third goal in the play-in victory. ... St. Johns carries only one senior, senior Rainen Owen. "She is an example of hard wok," Otto said. ... The team suffered three concussions during the season. "We made a lot of adjustments

throughout the season in positions and formations to find the right fit for the team," coach said. One of the changes he made was on offense, where three-year defender Avery James was moved up front three games ago. ... With only 19 players, the program played without a junior varsity team for the first time in a long time. ... The team's captains are attacking midfielder Bella Otto and defender Kasidee Johnson. They are juniors on a team with only one senior. The team's starting lineup usually consists of seven juniors, three sophomores and a freshman. The fast and smart Kara Meyer has been a "key component" on defense the past three seasons. "Our players have fight in them," coach said. "They're competitive and are going to play hard not matter the score. They will give their all."


Chino Valley (15-2): "The biggest reason for our team's success is the off season work ethic of the players and coaches," coach Allen Foster said. "We aren't close to any of the big club programs, so we have to put in a lot of time and effort in the off season to try and keep up. We have summer strength and agility training four days a week along with camps that we offer and attend." ... Chino Valley scored about the same amount of goals as last year and allowed almost the same. But this year's defense is much improved, Foster said. Chino Valley's defense struggled last year in the championship game. On offense, every player on the team has scored, with sophomore Madison Foster (27 goals, 12 assists), freshman Kaitlyn Roskopf (19 goals), sophomore Sabrina Lopez (4 goals, 13 assists) leading the way. Ashley McGuffey, one of only four seniors on the teams, has scored nine goals. ... Senior goalkeeper Kacey Matthews has nine shutouts, and her goals against average is .718.

Blue Ridge (14-4-2): "Our team has struggled the past two seasons, and our team knew they would have to work hard during the off-season," coach Eric Fogle said. "Our players showed great dedication and determination

this year in an effort to improve. Furthermore, our team put a strong emphasis on being united, knowing that our team could only excel if we utilized the strengths of every player and everyone felt supported and valued." ... The team didn't drop a region and home game this season and won as many games this year as it did during the last two years. "Each player on our team has improved tremendously, therefore the individual achievements would be difficult to list," Fogle said. "In comparison to last season, our defense has allowed half as many goals and our offense has scored 50% more goals, which I believe is a testament to our team's improvement and all the hard work they put in during the off season." ... Blue Ridge's last playoff appearance was in 2016 and won state titles from 2012-15. ... The team's average GPA is 3.78 and volunteers at various community events, including manning aid stations for local races, Fogle said.




