PROPOSED AMENDMENT - POLICIES AND PROCEDURES - SPORTS MEDICINE

43.3 <u>CONCUSSION EDUCATION</u> – All student athletes shall complete the Brainbook online concussion education course. Student athletes participating in sports shall complete the course. All student-athletes shall complete the course prior to participation in practice or competition.

43.4 CONCUSSION POLICY

43.4.1.1 All AIA Participating schools must have a concussion policy on file: The policy must address the following:

- Concussion Education
- Removal from Play
- Return to Play
- Return to Academics

43.4.5 Return to Academics

- Cognitive rest, including reduced screen time, may be recommended for the first 24-48 hours.
- Student-athletes can engage in sub-symptom cognitive activities as tolerated.
- Cognitive exertions should be stopped if concussion symptoms exacerbation is more than mild and brief and may be resumed once symptoms have returned to their prior level. Milde symptom exacerbation is typically brief and does not delay recovery.
- Schools should have policies to facilitate academic support, especially those that address factors that may prolong return to the classroom (e.g. High symptom burden, social determinants of health).
- Not all student-athletes will need academic support or a return to learn strategy.
- While return to learn and return to sport strategies can occur in parallel, student athletes should complete return to learn before unrestricted return to sport.
- Returning an athlete to the classroom following a concussion should follow a return to learn progression.

Recommended by the Sports Medicine Advisory Committee.

On a motion made, seconded, and carried, the Executive Board denied the above proposed amendment.

STUDENT ELIGIBILITY APPEAL

SCHOOL VIOLATIONS

GILBERT CHRISTIAN HIGH SCHOOL - Gilbert Christian Schools

Rule: Article 15. Student Eligibility Rules, Section 7 Physical Examination Rule (15.7.1)

Reported Violation:

A late addition to our spiritline roster was allowed to participate in 2 practices prior to completing the required Brainbook and Opioid courses. We were notified of the violation by the head coach after she realized her name was not on the pre-approved list provided by our department. The required courses were completed and submitted immediately upon this discovery.

Schools Corrective Action:

We will continue to use our thorough system of screening and pre-approving registrations, which includes providing a list of cleared names to our coaches. Our coach discovered and reported this violation on her own, so everyone involved is very aware that a mistake was made, but we will review the bylaws with the entire coaching staff and put even more emphasis on confirming eligibility of late additions.

Executive Board Action:

The Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Gilbert Christian High School **Spiritline Program** on **Advisement** for one year 9/13/23-9/13/24.

CRISMON HIGH SCHOOL – Queen Creek Unified

Rule: Article 15. Student Eligibility Rules, Section 7 Physical Examination Rule (15.7.1)

Reported Violation:

A 9th grade student came out to practice to watch and was helping as a manager for the FR/SO team. The lower-level coaches talked to him and did not check "Register My Athlete" for his clearance and gave him gear to start practicing without checking to see if the student was cleared. He was allowed to practice in helmet to get his conditioning done and did not check with athletic office to see if he was cleared.

Schools Corrective Action:

The head JV coach has been met with and discussed the importance of checking the Register My Athlete account. He has also been instructed from this point forward if any new student is to come out, they must bring him a clearance note from the athletic office before any gear is to be distributed. The equipment manager has also been informed to check RMA for all students to make sure they are cleared before checking any gear out.

Executive Board Action:

The Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Crismon High School **Football Program** on **Warning** for one year 9/13/23-9/13/24.

SCHOOL VIOLATIONS – Cont'd

GILBERT HIGH SCHOOL - Gilbert Public Schools

Rule: Article 15. Student Eligibility Rules, Section 7 Physical Examination Rule (15.7.1)

Reported Violation:

- Student was granted permission by his coach and practiced with team. He had a completed AIA physical evaluation; however the student did not submit it to our school's Athletics office.
- Student was granted permission by his coach and practiced with the team. He had yet to turn in a valid physical. His previous physical evaluation was last completed in February of 2023.
- -These were both discovered late afternoon on 8/16/23. Both boys and girls cross-country coaches were addressed the next day (please see below).

Schools Corrective Action:

The boys cross-country coach was relieved of his coaching duties on campus within 24 hours of the Athletics office receiving this information. The same applies to the girls cross-country coach. Although this is not a direct violation within her program, the teams practice together and the coach was aware of the situation as well. The two students mentioned earlier will not be allowed to practice until they receive full clearance from our Athletics office.

Executive Board Action:

The Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, <u>accepted</u> the report from Gilbert High School.

FLORENCE HIGH SCHOOL - Florence Unified School District

Rule: Article 43. Sports Medicine, Section 2 Opioid Education (43.2)

Reported Violation:

The opioid education course was left out of the clearance process (RMA) for FHS athletes. The error was brought to our attention when we had a new student athlete register for school and clearance to participate in Fall sports.

Schools Corrective Action:

We have instructed all fall FHS athletes to complete the Opioid ASAP. We have added the Opioid certificate to our clearance process through RMA.

Executive Board Action:

Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Florence High School **Activities Program** on **Advisement** for one year 9/13/23-9/13/24.
