SCHOOL VIOLATIONS

<u>**RINCON/UNIVERSITY HIGH SCHOOL**</u> – Tucson Unified School District <u>Rule: Article 14. General Provisions, Section 2 Practice (14.2.2)</u>

Reported Violation:

An RUHS wrestler from Afghanistan, spoke to the head coach about his cousin volunteering as a coach. The student called the coach on Sunday night and asked if he could bring his cousin to practice. When he arrived with his cousins, it turned out they were wrestlers from Catalina High School. After they observed for a while the coach asked them if they wanted to demonstrate since they did some good moves in the match with Catalina the week before. He thought the two wrestlers came to practice because they did not have practice. At the William Bell Tourney, our coach spoke to the Catalina coach about it. The Catalina coach was already unhappy about the wrestlers being ineligible and not making weight. Our coach should not have allowed wrestlers form another school to practice or demonstrate. Due to the students being from Afghanistan, there appears there may be some misunderstanding about rules in Arizona high school.

Schools Corrective Action:

RUHS will go over policies with the coach to make sure this type of thing does not happen again. RUHS will review AIA bylaws and TUSD Guidelines and Interscholastic Handbook with coach.

Executive Board Action:

The Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Rincon/University High School **Boys' Wrestling Program** on <u>Warning</u> for one year 12/11/23-12/11/24.

SCHOOL VIOLATIONS - Cont'd

<u>GILA RIDGE HIGH SCHOOL</u> – Yuma Union High School District Rule: Article 15. Student Eligibility Rules, Section 3 Enrollment Rule (15.3.1)

Reported Violation:

A home school student had open enrolled in Gila Ridge High School and participated on the football, wrestling and track team for the 2022/23 season as well as the 2023/24 varsity football season. Student's home school is Kofa High School.

Schools Corrective Action:

As a part of our clearance process, Gila Ridge will not enter/cross check every student-athlete individually and verify that each student-athlete listed on RMA is also a student on Synergy. If a student is identified as a home school student, the attached form will not be used to ensure all proper documentation is provided. With this form, we can easily check to see if the student-athlete is within Gila Ridge boundaries.

Executive Board Action:

The Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Gila Ridge High School **Athletics Program** on <u>Warning</u> for one year 12/11/23-12/11/24.

FLOWING WELLS HIGH SCHOOL - Flowing Wells

Rule: Article 15. Student Eligibility Rules, Section 7 Physical Examination Rule (15.7.1)

Reported Violation:

Athlete A was allowed to participate in practice by wrestling staff without being cleared through the Athletic Office. Flowing Wells utilizes Final Forms. Athlete was missing last 2 pages of Part 4.

Schools Corrective Action:

Athletic Director met with all wrestling coaches to discuss the violation and reminded of the consequences. All coaches were given copies and reviewed Article 16. All coaches have been given Final Form accounts and directed to schedule a tutorial with Final Forms.

Executive Board Action:

The Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Flowing Wells High School **Wrestling Program** on <u>Warning</u> for one year 12/11/23-12/11/24.

SCHOOL VIOLATIONS - Cont'd

<u>COCONINO HIGH SCHOOL</u> – Flagstaff Unified School District Rule: Article 15. Student Eligibility Rules, Section 7 Physical Examination Rule (15.7.1)

Reported Violation:

Wrestling was not cleared through RMA.

Schools Corrective Action:

Meeting with coaches about the importance of this process and checking their RMA account daily for clearances. Will require coaches to check with me daily for their cleared athlete list instead of them looking it up themselves. Further violations will result in disciplinary action from the school.

Executive Board Action:

The Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Coconino High School **Wrestling Program** on <u>Warning</u> for one year 12/11/23-12/11/24.

<u>MICA MOUNTAIN HIGH SCHOOL</u> – Vail Unified School District Rule: Article 15. Student Eligibility Rules, Section 7 Physical Examination Rule (15.7.1)

Reported Violation:

Wrestler was practicing without Physical Form uploaded on Aktivate website.

Schools Corrective Action:

Coach will be suspended for one wrestling meet and will be documented on coaches final evaluation.

Executive Board Action:

The Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Mica Mountain High School **Wrestling Program** on <u>Warning</u> for one year 12/11/23-12/11/24.

<u>CORONADO HIGH SCHOOL</u> – Scottsdale Unified School District <u>Rule: Article 15. Student Eligibility Rules, Section 7 Physical Examination Rule (15.7.1)</u>

Reported Violation:

Student did not properly clear RMA and participated in cheer practice without a physical.

Schools Corrective Action:

• Head Coach will review AIA Bylaws with Athletic Director (Specifically AIA Bylaw 15.7).

• Head Coach received a Letter of Direction along with a two-game suspension.

• Head Coach is required to develop a plan to ensure that this type of incident will not occur in the future to be approved by the school and district athletic directors.

• Cheer coaches will meet with Athletic Director one week prior to tryouts for each season to review the status of each potential participant. Follow-up meeting will take place the day before tryouts to verify who is permitted to tryout.

Executive Board Action:

The Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Coronado High School **Spiritline Program** on <u>Warning</u> for one year 12/11/23-12/11/24.

SCHOOL VIOLATIONS - Cont'd

BASHA HIGH SCHOOL – Chandler Unified School District

Rule: Article 17. Coaches and Coaching, Section 3 Completion of Contest - Ejection of Coach (17.3.1)

Reported Violation:

One of our football coaches was ejected from the contest. He did not immediately leave the area. He walked out of the stadium and grabbed his belongings in the press box, and walked back down to the fence line where he was talking with parents. I then made contact with him when I saw him at the fence and told him to leave the premises and that he could no longer stay in the stadium. He did not instruct or coach after he was ejected.

Schools Corrective Action:

AD met with the coaches the following morning and had a corrective meeting. As the AD, I should have been clearer to the coach needing to leave the premises. We have since reviewed the AIA bylaws and reiterated the need to remain calm and not be ejected in the first place. A football staff meeting also occurred to review AIA bylaws, and reset the expectations of our coaches, and athletic director in these situations.

Executive Board Action:

The Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Basha High School **Football Program** on **Advisement** for one year 12/11/23-12/11/24.

CANYON VIEW HIGH SCHOOL – Agua Fria Union High School District

Rule: Article 27. Soccer, Section 3 Preseason Interschool Varsity Scrimmage (27.3.1.2)

Reported Violation:

A preseason scrimmage was scheduled between Canyon View, Youngker, and Dysart girls' varsity soccer teams. Canyon View was the host. Upon arrival, officials let the Canyon View coach know they were allotted 80 minutes between the 3 teams. The coaches agreed to 40 minutes each and played 40 minutes after the AIA officials left. Canyon View head coach made the call to do this.

Schools Corrective Action:

AD met with head coach and went over bylaws, coach received a letter of direction, coach instructed to call her direct AD for questions prior to making decisions about games/scrimmages, officials.

Executive Board Action:

The Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Canyon View High School **Girls' Soccer Program** on <u>Advisement</u> for one year 12/11/23-12/11/24.

NEW MEMBER SCHOOLS – APPLICATION

BASIS Scottsdale
