STUDENT ELIGIBLITY APPEAL REQUEST FOR HARDSHIP ELIGIBILITY – MAXIMUM PARTICIPATION

- 15.9 <u>MAXIMUM PARTICIPATION RULE</u> After a student first enrolls in the ninth grade, he/she has a maximum of eight semesters of opportunity and a maximum of four seasons of opportunity in each sport or activity. **Semesters 1-8 must be consecutive.**

STUDENT ELIGIBLITY APPEAL REQUEST FOR HARDSHIP ELIGIBILITY – AGE RULE / BIRTH RECORD RULE

- 15.6.1 <u>Age Limits</u> If a student becomes 19 years of age on or after September 1, he/she is eligible to compete for the remainder of that school year. If he/she becomes 19 years of age before September 1, he/she is not eligible for any part of that school year.

WILLIAMS FIELD HIGH SCHOOL - Higley Unified

Rule: Article 14. General Provisions, Section 2 Practice (14.2.2)

Rule: Article 14. General Provisions, Section 4 Nonschool Participation (14.4.1)

Rule: Article 15. Student Eligibility Rules. Section 3 Enrollment Rule (15.3.1)

Reported Violation:

Members of the boys' volleyball team leading up to the state tournament engaged in a scrimmage that included individuals not enrolled at the member school.

Schools Corrective Action:

Contest forfeited. Coaches professional development will include a more in depth explanation of the pertinent bylaws and education on who may participate in practices during the season of sport.

Executive Board Action:

The Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Williams Field High School **Boys Volleyball Program** on **Probation** for one year 8/12/24-8/12/25, vacated all 2024 tournament games and vacated the 2024 championship title.

On a secondary motion made, seconded and carried the Executive Board moved the 2024 boys' volleyball state championship title to Casteel High School.

SCHOOL VIOLATIONS – Cont'd

<u>GLENDALE HIGH SCHOOL</u> – Glendale Union High School District Rule: Article 15. Student Eligibility Rules, Section 3 Enrollment Rule (15.3.1)

Reported Violation:

We held a football camp for incoming 8th graders on 4/27 and 5/4. On Monday, 5/6 an 8th grader participated in our spring ball.

Schools Corrective Action:

An in-service of the eligibility rules was provided to include expectations and best practices on organization and attendance records of all participants regardless of season. Liability concerns and expectations were also expressed to the football coaches. We will be providing some oversight to assist the program as well.

Executive Board Action:

The Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Glendale High School **Football Program** on **Warning** for one year 8/12/24-8/12/25.

Matt Belden abstained.

<u>KOFA HIGH SCHOOL</u> – Yuma Union High School District Rule: Article 21. Baseball, Section 1 Rules (21.1.5)

Reported Violation:

We had a pitcher that threw in last night's game vs Youngker (4/19) that was not supposed to pitch until he had 4 days rest. He was on his 4th day of rest. My head coach notified me immediately after the game as it was an oversight. Youngker's coach is aware and so is Tonya (AD at Youngker).

Schools Corrective Action:

Contest forfeited. After speaking with the coach, we will have more diligence with our pitch counts. The coaching staff will be posting their pitching rotation and days' rest in their coaching book and in the dugouts at each game.

Executive Board Action:

The Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Kofa High School **Baseball Program** on **Warning** for one year 8/12/24-8/12/25.

Enrollment rule: 8th grade students allowed to wrestle with Liberty team during winter break practices. Recruitment rule: 8th grade non-feeder school student at wrestling matches with the team, and on team

communication during the season.

Schools Corrective Action:

Head Coach has been suspended for one calendar year from the program.

Executive Board Action:

The Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Liberty High School **Boys' Wrestling Program** on **Warning** for one year 8/12/24-8/12/25.

It shall be the responsibility of the local school administrator to ensure that all other eligibility requirements are met before a student participates in interscholastic activities

EMERGING SPORT CONSIDERATION – BOYS' BEACH VOLLEYBALL
