SCHOOL VIOLATIONS

WINDOW ROCK HIGH SCHOOL - Window Rock Unified

Rule: Article 15. Student Eligibility Rules, Section 4 Academic Rule (15.4.1)

Reported Violation:

It was determined that Window Rock had academically ineligible football players playing in the JV game.

Schools Corrective Action:

JV eligibility will be personally reviewed by the varsity head coach before boarding the bus and/or field.

Executive Board Action:

The Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, <u>accepted</u> the Window Rock High School violation report.

GANADO HIGH SCHOOL - Ganado Unified School District

Rule: Article 14. General Provisions, Section 4 Nonschool Participation (14.4.1)

Reported Violation:

A varsity volleyball student participation in a high school staff vs/ students' game on October 30th.

Schools Corrective Action:

Coaches did inform students that they were not able to participate in the game. The student athlete is ineligible for the remaining of the AIA volleyball season. We are also working without student council to not schedule inseason competition vs staff in the future. By rescheduling these types of school functions, the student athletes can play and feel part of the school community. This way student athletes are not tempted to forgo eligibility by playing in-season competition at school functions.

Executive Board Action:

The Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, <u>accepted</u> the Ganado High School violation report.

MESQUITE HIGH SCHOOL – Gilbert Public Schools

Rule: Article 32. Volleyball, Section 5. Number of Games in Season (32.5.3)

Reported Violation:

Mesquite High School had a girls' volleyball game and competed in more than 6 sets in our match.

Schools Corrective Action:

Contest forfeited. Reviewed rules and bylaw with coaching staff.

Executive Board Action:

The Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Mesquite High School **Volleyball Program** on **Advisement** for one year 11/18/24-11-18/25.

SCHOOL VIOLATIONS – Cont'd

<u>VISTA GRANDE HIGH SCHOOL</u> – Casa Grande Unified High School District Rule: Article 24. Football, Section 5 Number of Games in Season (24.5.3)

Reported Violation:

Student played in 6 quarters of a Frosh/So and Varsity football games dating: October 30, 2024 and November 1, 2024.

Schools Corrective Action:

Contest Forfeited. Educate all head coaches on the AIA Bylaws and Constitution. Coaches will sign a memorandum of understanding that they are knowledgeable in regards to the respective sports. Our varsity football coach will be suspended for the entirety of the contest on November 8, 2024 against Combs High School.

Executive Board Action:

The Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Vista Grande High School **Football Program** on **Advisement** for one year 11/18/24-11-18/25.

<u>PALO VERDE HIGH SCHOOL</u> – Tucson Unified School District Rule: Article 15. Student Eligibility Rules, Section 7 Physical Examination (15.7.1)

Reported Violation:

Palo Verde had a girls' basketball player practice without being cleared, and no valid physical.

Schools Corrective Action:

The player has a similar name to her sister and was mistaken as her. Coaches evaluation will reflect this oversight and a review of our internal checks and balances.

Executive Board Action:

The Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Palo Verde High School **Girls' Basketball Program** on **Warning** for one year 11/18/24-11-18/25.

SCHOOL VIOLATIONS - Cont'd

SAFFORD HIGH SCHOOL – Safford Unified

Rule: Article 43. Sports Medicine, Section 2 Opioid Education // Section 3 Concussion Education (43.2 and 43.3)

Reported Violation:

Student participated in soccer tryouts without having completed Brainbook or Opioid courses. Student was not cleared in FinalForms. Upon investigation the coach confused her with another athlete, and did not adequately verify clearance.

Schools Corrective Action:

Current policies and procedures are in place for coaches to validate athlete "clearances" through FinalForms. As a veteran coach, it should not have happened, and he takes responsibility for the mistake. There will be no changes to current procedures. Violation will be addressed as part of his formal evaluation process.

Executive Board Action:

The Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Safford High School **Activities Program** on **Advisement** for one year 11/18/24-11-18/25.

DESERT VISTA HIGH SCHOOL – Tempe Union High School District

Rule: Article 15. Student Eligibility Rules, Section 7 Physical Examination Rule (15.7.1)

Reported Violation:

A student athlete participated in competition without being appropriately cleared. This was due to an oversight by the athletic department and the football program. A new AD, new administrative assistant and a new head football coach all starting at the state of the year may have contributed.

Schools Corrective Action:

Contest forfeited. We will have a training/workshop with all head coaches on all items that need to be submitted into RMA prior to tryouts. We revamped our communication to our head coaches prior to each season of sport regarding which students are cleared and which students cannot tryout. Communication to parents will happen not only through RMA but also through ParentSquare, which is district mandated.

Executive Board Action:

The Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Desert Vista High School **Activities Program** on **Warning** for one year 11/18/24-11-18/25.

SCHOOL VIOLATIONS – Cont'd

MADISON HIGHLAND PREP

Rule: Article 14. General Provisions, Section 4 Nonschool Participation

Reported Violation:

Student athlete participated with a club soccer team on 9/21, 9/22 and 9/28. Student admitted to knowing the rules if he participated in the events and thought he would just get kicked off the team if it was discovered.

Schools Corrective Action:

Madison Highland Prep takes this violation very seriously and is committed to responding appropriately. MHP will forfeit the games that Josiah competed in on 09/26/2024, 09/30/2024, and 10/02/2024 while ineligible. Josiah has been terminated from the MHP soccer program, and permanently banned from athletic participation at MHP. Despite Josiah being one of the best players on the MHP team and the impact his removal will have on the MHP team, it is necessary to take these actions to protect the spirit of sportsmanship within MHP's athletic programs, and just as importantly among our fellow AIA member schools.

Further, MHP will immediately implement a Nonschool Participation contract (attached) that all student-athletes and parents must sign to continue Fall participation. This contract will then become standard in the MHP Athletic Registration packet (paper document for 2024-2025, electronic document on RMA beginning 2025-2026). At our Winter Coach meeting, all coaches will receive an AIA Bylaw Hot Topic chart that includes quick reference to the following topics: Student Transfers, Nonschool Participation, Recruitment, and Sportsmanship (attached).

Executive Board Action:

The Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Madison Highland Prep **Boys' Soccer Program** on **Warning** for one year 11/18/24-11-18/25.
