RULES COMMITTEE

RULES

Rules shall be those of the current USGA Rules of Golf, AIA Constitution and Bylaws, and these tournament instructions:

SCORING:

All the AIA Golf Championships scoring is paperless, all scoring will be live scoring using AIA Golf app powered by iWanamaker. The electronic scorecard exchange is mandatory for all players. Like the scoring of events during the regular season, individual players will be assigned to score for one other player in the group. At the starting tent, the starters will reaffirm all players are prepared to live score during the event with adequately charged batteries and a working knowledge of the scoring procedures. Any player not properly prepared at the starting tee will not be allowed to participate in that day's round, a D/Q will be reported as the player's score. Coaches <u>WILL NOT</u> be allowed to substitute another player. If a player should have a battery failure during the round, the player will be withdrawn from the event and the player will be scored as disqualified (D/Q). All coaches should have one or two portable battery chargers in the event of a player's battery failure. Post round scoring will be on the finishing hole or the designated scoring area. Mobile devices will only be permitted to be out from Green to Tee. Players shall report to their assigned tee a minimum of 10 minutes prior to their starting time. After the round all players shall immediately report to the designated scoring area to confirm scores with the Games Committee.

COACHING

Coaching will be permitted as per USGA Rules of Golf, Rule 24.4 - Each team may have one (1) designated coach per match/ tournament. **Coaches may not be on the greens or in the bunkers.**

DRESS CODE

All team members shall wear proper attire that includes:

- Belts on boys
- Neat and clean clothing
- Hats worn properly (bills forward)
- Sleeves and collars on boys' shirts. Shirts must be tucked in.
- Collared shirts with or without sleeves on girls
- Athletic shirts without collars that are specifically for golf (i.e. Lululemon with sleeves).
- NO tank tops or T-shirts
- Capri Pants, shorts, skorts and skirts that are acceptable and appropriate for golf.
- Boy's shorts must NOT be lower than the bottom of the knee.
- Shorts, pants, or cargo shorts that are appropriate for golf.
- All clothing must be worn in a neat and respectable way (shirts must be tucked in).
- Girls' shirts should not rise above the belt line during the swing.
- Midriff must not be visible at any time during the golf swing.
- Local golf course rules may be more restrictive and will be followed.



Improper attire includes, but is not limited to:

Jeans, bathing suits, tank tops, tee shirts, halter tops, cutoffs, short shorts, tennis shorts, sweats, excessively baggy shorts, non-tailored cargo shorts or pants and dress of similar nature is inappropriate. The dress code will be enforced. All team members shall wear identical AIA approved golf shirts while participating in any inter-school competition. Proper attire must always be worn in the clubhouse, on the golf course and on the driving range. Please note that the AIA Tournament Staff has the right to deem other attire to be improper even if does not appear on the previous list.

Note: The Games Committee will be the sole judge of all improper attire. A player that is deemed to be wearing improper attire will not be allowed on the course until he/she is wearing proper golf attire. The Games Committee's decision will be final.

Unsportsmanlike Conduct

Per AIA Bylaw **26.9.1.11** Inappropriate behavior (club throwing, abusive or profane language, mistreatment of the golf course, etc.) will be dealt with by the Games Committee. A player may be disqualified from the tournament.

Distance Measuring Devices: Rangefinders

The use of a Distance Measuring Device: per **USGA (14-3)** and **Arizona Interscholastic Association** adoption are permitted in all high school play (including regular season matches and tournaments as well as the State Tournament).

Tournament Organization

The State Tournament shall be run as a team tournament. The five players of each team shall be played in consecutive tee times. Second day pairings will be based upon first day results.

Trophies and Medals

- Awards will be as noted in the AIA Constitution and Bylaws.
- The winning team and runners-up team will receive team trophies.
- Individual medals will be awarded to the top 10 places.

Slow Play

Slow play cannot be tolerated, and coaches are encouraged to monitor slow play closely. Slow play may lead to stroke penalties and participant disqualification. Rules and Games Committee will monitor the pace of play and rounds should take no longer than 4 hours and 30 minutes.

SPECTATOR INFORMATION

- Spectators must check in at AIA entrance table or the first/tenth tee to purchase their spectator badge/land yard, which must be worn while on the golf course.
- Spectators will not be allowed on the driving range or practice putting green and must always remain on the cart path or at least 30 yards away from the group if a cart path is not available. Any contact could be construed as giving advice. (USGA Rules of Golf, Rule 10.2a)
- Requests to use a golf cart must be submitted to the AIA and/or Tournament Director prior to the event. Requests will be approved if warranted based on documentation provided prior to the tournament. The use of carts will not carry over from the first day to the second day and will be rented only if there are available carts.
- Except for viewing "live results" on the AZPREPS365 golf app the use of cell phones or other electronic devices are prohibited while on the course.
- AIA Bylaw: Article 16.3.4 stipulates that student spectators, parents, or other non-school personnel that initiate or use profanity in cheers or cheers having the intent of sounding profane, single out opposing players personally and/or heckle them by directing derogatory or profane statements or chants at them, use racist remarks or direct offensive cheers /chants at opposing individuals, teams or fans are in violation of the AIA sportsmanship rules. Any spectator conduct that becomes unruly or interferes with the orderly progress of the match will result in the offending spectator(s) being removed from the golf course site.

ADA COMPLIANCE NOTICE

It is the policy of the Arizona Interscholastic Association not to discriminate based on disability in admission to, access to, or operation of its programs, services and activities, or in its hiring and employment practices.

Persons with a disability may request reasonable accommodation, such as sign language interpreter, by making a request to the office staff. Requests should be made as early as possible to allow time to arrange the accommodation.

The editor/manager of an outlet already granted access to AIA media credentials must go online and order credentials for a member of the media not on the master list. Please note that some members of the media might show up with freelance credentials. These have no pictures on them but do allow for access to the event per the designated media outlet on the AIA media credential. Additionally, all member schools were allotted several school-based credentials for the school year. These will allow admittance equal to a media or freelance credential.

Aguilla (8440 S. 35th Avenue) Hosting Practice Round information:

Aguila will host a practice round for: **Division I boys and girls** – Friday, October 31st, starting at 9:30am **Division II boys and girls** – Friday, October 24th, starting 9:30am **Division III -** Friday, May 8th, starting at 11:00 a.m. (TBD)

Invitations will be sent out to the 10-15 highest-ranked teams in iWanamaker 10 days prior to the practice round date. Tee times are set based on ranking in iWanamaker and will alternate boys teams and girls teams. The number one ranked boys team will go at 9:30. The number one ranked girls team will go at 9:40 and so on, every 10 minutes. When invitations are emailed, please confirm your time by emailing <u>michael.owens@phoenix.gov</u>. Do not call the golf shop to confirm your tee time. Michael Owens will need email verification to lock in your scheduled time.

Teams can bring up to five players, and fivesomes will be allowed. The price is \$25.00 per player (one coach's cart, range balls, and tax included). Any team that plans on having a substitute player can bring them along to ride with the coach, but only five players are permitted to play.

The "Pace of Play" is 4 hours and 20 minutes. Please ensure the players on your team maintain and <u>no</u> spectators are allowed at the practice round.

Players can also practice on their own and receive the junior rate, but team-organized practice rounds are limited to the scheduled practice round date for their respective division. If a player does wish to practice on their own, rounds can only be booked 7 days or less in advance. Junior rates at Aguila are 22.00 + tax.

Practice availability is anytime from Monday through Saturday. Bylaw 14.2.1 **must** be adhered to—no practice, chalk talk, or films are permitted on **Sunday** during the school year.

The last day for players to practice at Aguilla is: Division I – Saturday November 1st Division II – Saturday October 25th Division III - Saturday, May 9th
