## **ACTION ITEMS:**

# **ARBITER PAY – LATE FEES**

When a school's Arbiter Pay is in arrears and deficient they are sent an Insufficient Fund email advising of their Current Balance and their Insufficient Balance. This triggers a late fee invoice to the school of 8% of their negative balance. Each week the school is in the arrears it prompts additional late fees and are invoiced. In some cases, the late fee has been minimal and ineffective. So, it is being requested to create a \$20 minimum late fee for being in the arrears for Arbiter Pay to match and be consistent with the \$20 game change fee.

# SANTA RITA HIGH SCHOOL - Tucson Unified School District

Rule: Article 28. Softball, Section 3 Preseason Interschool Varsity Scrimmage (28.3.1.1)

#### **Reported Violation:**

Santa Rita had only 8 eligible softball players and given it was senior night with Catalina already on site a scrimmage was held to move forward and honor our seniors rather than end the season with a forfeit/cancellation.

# **Schools Corrective Action:**

Contest forfeited. Had an administrative conference with activities principal, athletic director and coach to review the NFHS Softball rules/regulations and reeducate on the proper practices moving forward.

#### **Executive Board Action:**

The Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Santa Rita High School **Softball Program** on **Warning** for one year 8/11/25-8/11/26.

# **CATALINA HIGH SCHOOL** – Tucson Unified School District

Rule: Article 28. Softball, Section 3 Preseason Interschool Varsity Scrimmage (28.3.1.1)

# **Reported Violation:**

8 players on their lineup sheet. Per Coach, both umpires and the host site AD informed him that the game could still be played as a scrimmage. The host site AD informed Catalina Coach that he would contact this writer to inform him the game would be played as a scrimmage. This writer is still waiting for that call. The officials dismissed themselves and the two teams engaged in approx. 3 innings of competition. The game was entered into the dashboard with a score in favor of Catalina and was later reported as Santa Rita Forfeit. Please see Catalina Coach addendum Chronology of this incident.

#### **Schools Corrective Action:**

Catalina Coaches from all season(s) of sport will be informed that any change(s) to a sanctioned event must be reported to the Athletic Director immediately prior to competition. Furthermore, be required to read/review their respective sport bylaw language as well as bylaw's 14 & 15.

## **Executive Board Action:**

The Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Catalina High School **Softball Program** on **Advisement** for one year 8/11/25-8/11/26.

# **SCHOOL VIOLATIONS** – Cont'd

<u>INDEPENDENCE HIGH SCHOOL</u> – Glendale Union High School District
Rule: Article 14. General Provisions, Section 3 Maximum Teams per Sport / Student Grade Level (14.3.2.1)

#### **Reported Violation:**

An EL student enrolled without any 11<sup>th</sup> grade credits. The student believed that means she was a junior. When completing the Register My Athlete, the student listed herself as a junior. It turned out the student is in fact a senior. Independence Athletics became aware of this when she was doing senior check-out. Student played the 24-25 season on JV even though she is a senior.

#### **Schools Corrective Action:**

Contests forfeited. Moving forward, we will make sure to cross reference our enrollments within Synergy with Register My Athlete. This will ensure that we are certain of the grade level of our students, especially those with unique enrollment situations like this student.

#### **Executive Board Action:**

The Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Independence High School **Activities Program** on **Advisement** for one year 8/11/25-8/11/26.

# BOULDER CREEK HIGH SCHOOL - Deer Valley Unified School District

Rule: Article 21. Baseball, Section 1 Rules (21.1.5)

# Reported Violation:

Student started a new batter at pitch number 96. The batter was 3 pitches totaling 98 pitches total.

#### **Schools Corrective Action:**

Contest forfeited. We are currently in the search of a new head baseball coach and program coaches. I as the AD will ensure that all coaches at all levels know the pitch count rules and have a training on this prior to season. I as the AD will forward all pitch count emails to every coach on staff as well as a protocol to communicate when a pitcher is over their count and why, such as if they finished a batter.

#### **Executive Board Action:**

The Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Boulder Creek High School **Baseball Program** on **Warning** for one year 8/11/25-8/11/26.

# **SCHOOL VIOLATIONS** - Cont'd

## BOULDER CREEK HIGH SCHOOL - Deer Valley Unified School District

Rule: Article 21. Baseball, Section 1 Rules (21.1.5)

#### **Reported Violation:**

Student was supposed to rest for 4 days from the game on 4/24, instead student athlete threw 35 pitches on the 3rd day against desert vista on 4/28/25.

# **Schools Corrective Action:**

We are currently in the search of a new head baseball coach and program coaches. I as the AD will ensure that all coaches at all levels know the pitch count rules and have a training on this prior to season. I as the AD will forward all pitch count emails to every coach on staff as well as a protocol to communicate when a pitcher is over their count and why, such as if they finished a batter.

# **Executive Board Action:**

The Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Boulder Creek High School **Baseball Program** on **Warning** for one year 8/11/25-8/11/26.

# **NOTRE DAME PREPARATORY** – Catholic Diocese of Phoenix

Rule: Article 15. Student Eligibility Rules, Section 3 Enrollment Rule (15.3.1)

# Reported Violation:

It was confirmed through video that two 8<sup>th</sup> grade students were allowed to participate in basketball practice with the NDP team. At the time of the incident, neither 8<sup>th</sup> grade student was officially enrolled at Notre Dame prep or cleared to participate in an AIA sanctioned sport.

# **Schools Corrective Action:**

Both athletic director and head boys' basketball coach, at the time of incident, are no longer employed at Notre Dame Prep.

#### **Executive Board Action:**

The Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, and in light of the corrective action taken by the school, placed the Notre Dame Preparatory **Boys' Basketball Program** on **Warning** for one year 8/11/25-8/11/26.

# AIA LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL - MEETING DATE

It is recommended that the annual AIA Legislative Council Meeting be held on **March 6**, **2026**. Based on a March 6, 2026 meeting date, and in accordance with Article 5, Section 1 of the AIA Constitution, the deadline for submitting an agenda item would be January 23, 2026. The agenda mail-out deadline would be February 6, 2026.

On a motion made, seconded and carried the Executive Board approved the date for Legislative Council.

#### TRAVEL AND EXCHANGE PROGRAMS

The Executive Board reaffirmed its determination of September 16, 1996 concerning Article 15, Section 15, Paragraph 1 of the AIA Bylaws, which states that the AIA member schools should recognize only the foreign exchange programs approved by the Council on Standards for International Educational Travel (CSIET) (<a href="https://www.csiet.org">www.csiet.org</a>).

The Executive Board directed that, as a convenience for AIA member schools, these official minutes reflect the travel and exchange programs listed in the CSIET's **2025-2026** edition of **Advisory List** - https://aiaonline.org/files/17830/current-csiet-advisory-list.pdf

It shall be the responsibility of the local school administrator to ensure that all other eligibility requirements are met before a student participates in interscholastic activities.

# FLAG FOOTBALL "KEEP THE BALL" EXPERIMENT – NFHS APPROVED

The experiment would allow for a "keep the ball option" if a team is trailing in the fourth quarter. Following a try attempt, the scoring team would be able to elect to retain possession (4<sup>th</sup> down and 15 yards) from its own 25-yard line. If the team is able to attain a first down (40-yard line), they would retain possession as normal. If the team is unsuccessful, they would turn the ball over on downs.

#### Rationale:

A team should have a low percentage mechanism to attempt to come from behind at the end of a game. Tackle football has an onside kick, but flag currently has no process. This would allow for a team to attempt to come from behind. This concept was heavily debated by the Flag Football Rules Committee. The concept had support, the committee was not sure on what the yardage should be and it was determined that the best course of action would be for states to experiment and report back on the conversion percentage.

Arizona is uniquely set up to provide experimental data as officials are required to complete a post-game report for all Varsity contests. We would require all flag football reports to identify when a "keep the ball" attempt occurred and whether it was successful. This will gauge the prevalence of attempts and determine the success rate of a 4<sup>th</sup> and 15 play. This data will accompany a rules proposal for the Flag Football Rules Committee to consider at the next meeting.

On a motion made, seconded and caried the Executive Board <u>approved</u> the experiment for flag football to begin during the 2025 season.

## **AMENDMENT – ARTICLE 25 – FLAG FOOTBALL**

# 25.5 NUMBER OF GAMES IN SEASON

25.5.3 No player shall participate in more than six (6) quarters/night. 13 games during the season, excluding qualifying and post-season tournaments.

On a motion made, seconded and carried the Executive Board **approved** the above amendment to the flag football policy.

# **AMENDMENT – POLICY AND PROCEDURES**

In all sports that allow scrimmages, game uniforms may now be worn during the scrimmage. Practice uniforms are optional and may be worn. Home and away team jerseys still must be followed for contrast during competition.

# **AMENDMENT – ARTICLE 14 – NONSCHOOL PARTICIPATION**

# 14.4 NONSCHOOL PARTICIPATION

<u>DETERMINATION</u>: An individual student may take private lessons anytime except during the school day or during school practice sessions. For purposes of this rule, individual private lesson means, and is limited to, one no more than two distinct students and one coach/instructor. Schools shall not pay for, arrange or in any way provide these individual private lessons. Individual private lessons shall not be used to circumvent or evade the non-school participation rule and any such use of private lessons will be considered a violation of the non-school participation rule.

On a motion made, seconded and carried the Executive Board <u>approved</u> the above amendment to the Nonschool Participation determination.

# 2025-2026 BEACH VOLLEYBALL RULEBOOK

On a motion made, seconded and carried the Executive Board <u>approved</u> the 2025-2026 Beach Volleyball Rulebook with the expectation that the committee will continue to monitor and review the policies.

# STUDENT ELIGIBLITY APPEAL

## REQUEST FOR HARDSHIP ELIGIBILITY - MAXIMUM PARTICIPATION

- 15.9 <u>MAXIMUM PARTICIPATION RULE</u> After a student first enrolls in the ninth grade, he/she has a maximum of eight semesters of opportunity and a maximum of four seasons of opportunity in each sport or activity. **Semesters 1-8 must be consecutive.**
